GRAHAM SMITH

Graham Smith is currently the Chairman of Luddendenfoot C.C.. A former player, he began umpiring when his career had finished and he has officiated in both the Halifax and Airedale & Wharfedale Leagues.

TOMMY SOUTHWELL

The late Tommy Southwell was a longtime patron of the Club. A Vice-President, he owned the ground and leased it to the Club for a nominal fee.

DAVID FISHER

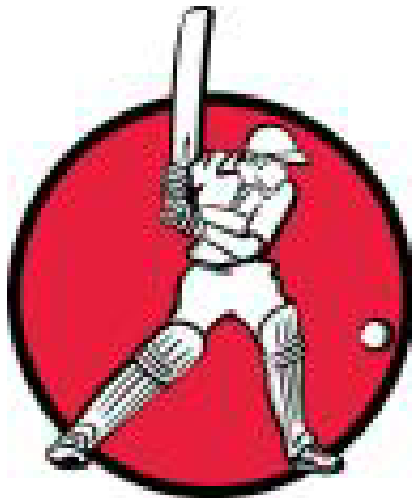
