Barrie and Christine Pettinger have become great Club stalwarts. Barrie is currently Chairman and Christine is Club secretary.

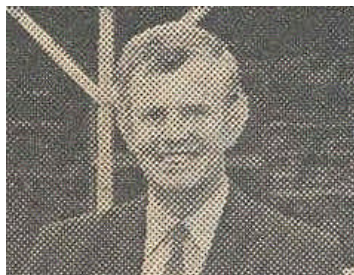


Mike Mullaney

It was awarded to the winners of the 2nd XI knockout competition and was won by Outlane in the inaugural season. When the Huddersfield Association folded in 1985, the cup was given to the Tolson Museum along with the league's other silverware.

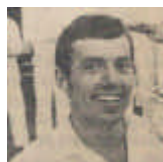


Peter Gronow
