

Six Big Names

Norman Collins

Captain of the S.B.C.I. team which won the Halifax League Division title in 1921 and went on to become president of the Halifax League.

Fred Bates

First team captain in the 1930s; later committee man, treasurer, league representative. Presented with an engraved dish in recognition of 50 years service in 1979 and commemorated in an engraved plaque in the pavilion. Illness curtailed the assistance he could give to the club in later life.

Willie Copley

Player; first team captain in 1931 and possibly earlier. Long-serving committee man. Opened the batting with Wilfred Rhodes in a fund raising match at Sowerby Bridge during the First World War.

Alan Hampshire

Long-serving player from early 1960s to around 1990; a loyal one-club man. Consistent swing bowler.

G. Seymour

Outstanding player in the 1950s; won Halifax Association Bowling Award four times between 1952 and 57 and the Batting Award in 1953.

John Scholefield

Player for over 20 years and, as secretary, a driving force behind the radical upgrading of the ground and the developments in youth cricket at the club over the last 15 years.
