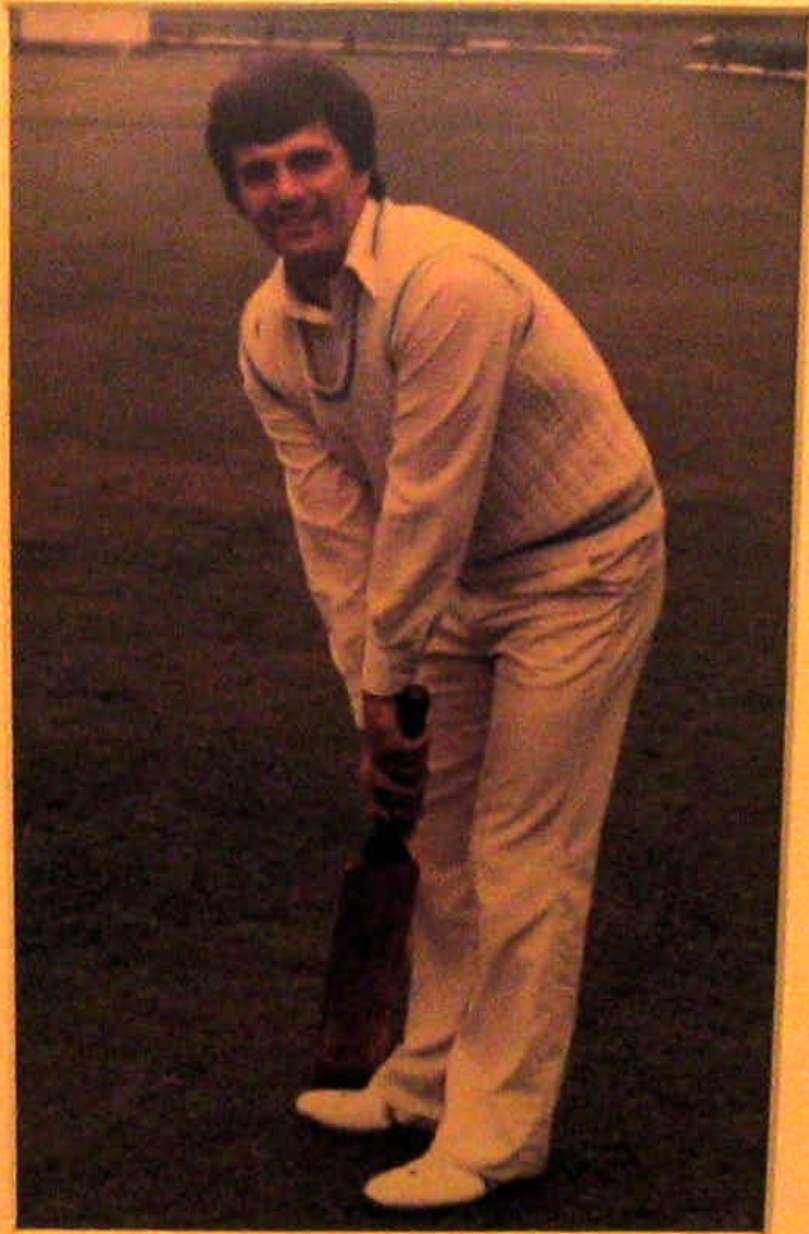
It's not just the cricketers who make who make it all work.

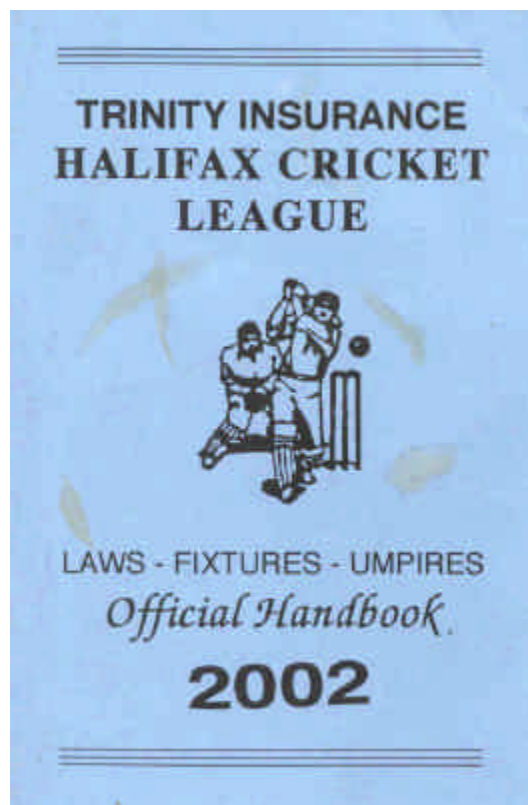
