

STONES CRICKET CLUB.

RULES

1. That this Club be called the "Stones Cricket Club".

COMMITTEE AND OFFICERS

2. All business connected with the club shall be managed by the General Committee of the Club.
3. The General Committee shall consist of the President, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman (who are designated as Officers of the Club) and twelve members of the Club who shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting of the Club. Any vacancy arising during any year shall not be filled until the next Annual General Meeting.
4. Five members shall constitute a quorum of the General Committee.
5. The Secretary shall notify each member of the General Committee of the date and time of each meeting, and apologies for absence shall be given to the Secretary prior to the meeting.
6. The Selection Committee of the Club shall consist of four non-playing members and the Captains (or Vice-Captains) of the 1st and 2nd elevens. The Committee shall select its own Chairman from the non-playing members of the Committee. In the event of equality of voting, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
7. The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held not later than the 30th November each year. At this meeting the following business shall be transacted:-
 - (a) The minutes of the preceding Annual General Meeting shall be read and confirmed and any business arising therefrom dealt with.
 - (b) Presentation and adoption of the Annual Report and Financial Statement of Accounts.
 - (c) Constitution of the number of teams for the ensuing season.
 - (d) Election of Officers:-
 - (i) President
 - (ii) Secretary
 - (iii) Treasurer
 - (iv) Chairman
 - (e) Election of Captains and Vice-Captains.
 - (f) Election of Selection Committee.
 - (g) Election of Auditors.
 - (h) Election of General Committee.
 - (i) Fix subscriptions.
 - (j) Alteration of Rules, if any (Any Alteration of Rule to be given in writing to the Secretary no later than the 30th September. Such alteration to be incorporated into the Agenda for the Annual General Meeting).
 - (k) Other business of which due notice has been given.
8. Fifteen members of the Club shall constitute a quorum of the Club.
9. A copy of the Financial Statements of Accounts and Agenda shall be sent to each member at least seven days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
10. That in electing Captains and Vice-Captains of the various teams any nomination

correctly submitted shall be noted, but after votes have been cast and no nominee has an overall majority of the meeting, then the nominee receiving the lowest number of votes shall be eliminated, Further ballots shall then be held in the same way until one nominee has the necessary overall majority.

11. Nominations for Captains and Vice-Captains of the 1st and 2nd Elevens, proposed and seconded shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting commences. Any unsuccessful nominations for Captain shall be available for Vice-Captain. The consent of all nominees must be first obtained. The previous season's Captain is automatically nominated should he wish to stand.
12. No new Rule can be made nor any other Rule be amended or rescinded except at a General Meeting of the Club. Written notice in accordance with Rule 7(d) must have been first given.
13. The Secretary shall call a Special General Meeting at the written request of ten members of the Club, but only when accompanied by details of the business to be introduced.

PRIZES, SUBSCRIPTIONS, TRANSFERS AND EXPENSES

14. Prizes (to be determined by the General Committee) to be awarded to the value equivalent to an adult members subscription to players of 1st, 2nd and 3rd teams with the best batting, bowling and fielding averages.
15. Players in 1st and 2nd teams must have ten innings, six complete, to qualify for the batting prize and have bowled sixty overs and taken twenty wickets to qualify for the bowling prize.
16. No talent money to be paid. No travelling expenses to be paid to any players except players in Junior League matches.
17. The Club shall pay all scorer's fees, such fees to be determined annually by the General Committee.
18. Players to play in six matches to qualify for a prize in the event of a team winning a League Trophy. In the event of a team winning the Challenge Cup anyone playing in a cup tie to qualify.
19. Playing members' subscriptions shall be paid not later than the fourth match of the Halifax Cricket League season.
20. In the event of a player transferring to another Club a proportionate part of his subscription, representative to the unexpired portion of the season, shall be refunded to him.

GENERAL

21. The Auditors shall audit the accounts of the Club and certify the correctness of the Financial Statement for the year.
22. The Treasurer shall receive all subscriptions and any other monies due to the Club and give a receipt for the same.
23. The Secretary shall enter all minutes and resolutions and conduct all the correspondence of the Club, and keep a record of attendances of the committee.

BRIAN HUNTER'S middleorder 35 kept Stones alive after Blackley had threatened to waltz away with eight points.

The first six Stones wickets went down for 24 as Brian Crabtree (five for 41 from 16 overs) tore into them. But Hunter, aided in a seventh wicket stand of 55 by Stuart Milner (21), limped Stones to a point.

Highlight of Blackley's innings was another fine knock from Peter Hennessey, fifth in last season's league averages. He clubbed two sixes and 10 fours in a knock of 64 and dominated an opening partnership of 61 with Graham Young, which laid the foundations for a respectable total, despite the efforts of Adrian Houker (five for 32 in 18 overs).
