Clifford Sykes, Thongbridge, consolidated his claim for the League batting medal by an innings of 55 not out against Huddersfield, for whom W. S. Hammond scored 35. Other players to pass the half-century mark were L. Haigh (Lancaster Hall) 55, F. Dyeon (Huddersfield) 54, E. Quarmby (Lithwall) 51, G. Knight (Huddersfield) 50, J. Whisnand (Huddersfield) 49, and G. Barker (Mashburn) 48. Among the best bowling figures were that of young David Hatcher of Peirson's Hill, who took six wickets for 49 against Paddock. Jack Goughier, the Dalton professional, had seven for 48 against Mashburn Mills, and Verity took five wickets for 47. W. W. Garside (Mashburn) took four for 37, J. Betanczy (Huddersfield) five for 36, I. Thompson (Marsden) four for 35, F. Barlow (Paddock) one for 27, E. T. Sayer (Huddersfield) one for 25, and F. Haigh (Kirkburton) one for 25.
