## Profits are trebled

AN action-packed summer enabled Kirkheaton Cricket and Bowling Club to treble their profits last year.

Members were told at the Huddersfield League club's annual meeting that profits had risen from £786 in 1983 to £2,440.

Bar sales had risen by 20%, and this was largely due to at least one cricket or bowling activity being held on 46 consecutive days or evenings during June and July.

Raffles also brought in £2,247, cricket ball sponsorship rose from £280 to £370 and £986 was raised from the sponsored Lyke Wake Walk.

Membership also rose by 24 to 633 and club secretary Alan Stephenson said:

"It is important to appreciate what a fortunate position we are in. It has only come about through the work of many hundreds of people during our existence and it is very important to realise that our present situation can only remain as it is, or even improve, through continued hard work, support and dedication to the club."
