← RULES. ←

1.—That this Club be called the "Slaitwaite Cricket & Fowling Club."

2.—The objects of the Club shall be to maintain and control the game of Cricket, Athletics, or Games, or other such Sports as the Committee see fit to adopt, also to use the premises as a social club to advance the well-being of its members.

3.—That the Club shall be managed by a President, five Vice-presidents, Treasurer, Financial and Corresponding Secretaries, and a committee of 18 members.

4.—That one half of the Committee and all other officials shall retire each year, and be re-elected, or fresh members in their places, at the Annual General Meeting to be held in November in each year.

5.—That the property or chattels of the Club shall be vested in the above-named officials for the time being, to be used in the interests of the Club.

6.—That the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer shall have their books audited to the end of October each year (oftener if required by the Committee) by two auditors appointed at the General Meeting each year, and shall prepare a balance sheet to be submitted and passed at such General Meeting.

7.—That in the first week of November each year the Secretary shall post notices up in the Pavilion and other public places, asking for nominations of officials and committee for the following season; such nominations to be sent to the Secretary in writing, with the name of the proposer, at least two clear days before such meeting. The election of officials and committee to be taken by ballot or show of hands.

8.—That the Committee meet once a week in the Pavilion, and at other times when called by the Secretary. Seven to form a quorum.

9.—That the Committee may elect Sub-committees to transact business for the Club, but the President, Vice-presidents, and Secretary shall be entitled to sit on such committees.

10.—That if any official or committeeman absents himself from four successive meetings (duly called) without explanation he shall be deemed to have resigned his position, and the Committee shall be empowered to fill any vacancy caused by resignation or otherwise of any official or committeeman of the Club.

11.—That any person desirous of joining the Club shall be proposed and seconded, and his name posted up in the Pavilion, at least three clear days before being elected by the Committee.

12.—That playing members-

contributions for the year shall be five shillings; members under twenty years of age, contribution to be three shillings and sixpence; junior members under seventeen years of age, contribution to be two shillings and sixpence. No member under seventeen years of age to be supplied with intoxicating liquors.

13.—That the Committee may appoint the captains of the first and second teams for the season, who shall have sole control of all the matches.

14.—That the Committee shall select teams for all matches, such teams to be posted up in the pavilion three days before any such match. Any player unable to take part must cross off his name or give notice to the captain 24 hours before such match.

15.—That practice for playing members shall be under the control of the professional or persons appointed by the Commit-

tee. All members to be allowed to play in rotation as they arrive on the ground, and take their share of fielding, but the professional or persons appointed may pitch special wickets for the first eleven to practice on at any time. No person will be allowed in the enclosure with clogs on. No person residing within two miles of the ground, unless a member, to be allowed to take part in any practice, but any person residing without the said limits, being introduced by a member, may do so not more than twice during a season. Players must cease practice immediately the bell rings to commence a match.

16.—That the Club give five shillings to each member who scores 50 runs away from home, and two shillings and sixpence for 30 runs. A collection will be made for members scoring 50 runs at home matches, and two shillings and sixpence will be given to members scoring 30 runs.

FIELDING.

Also any fielder catching three players in one match shall receive two shillings and sixpence.

17.—That an honorary member subscribing three shillings and upwards shall be allowed on the ground free of charge, except at benefit matches. The Committee reserve the right to charge for admission when the ground is used for other sports not named on the card.

18.—That members subscribing twenty shillings and upwards shall be on the patron list of the Club, provided they do not hold any other office in the Club.

19.—That no person shall have a card of membership if on receiving due notice he has not paid his subscription for the previous year.

20.—Any person doing wilful damage to any property of the

If a player secures 6 wickets for 30 runs or under, or performs the hat trick away from home, he shall receive five shillings from the Club. For home matches a player securing six wickets for 30 runs or under he shall receive five shillings, and for the hat trick a collection shall be made on his behalf. No player shall receive talent money until he has paid his subscription. A player must bat in 12 innings before he is eligible to claim the club prize, value one guinea, for best batting average.

SECOND TEAM.

If a player gets 50 runs at home or away matches he shall receive five shillings from the Club.

BOWLING.

A player securing six wickets for 30 runs, or who performs the hat trick, shall receive five shillings from the Club.

STUMPER.

That the stumper in the first eleven shall receive two shill-

Club will be required to make it good or will be liable to expulsion or otherwise as the committee think fit.

21.—That on complaint of improper conduct in the field or pavilion, the committee shall investigate the case and deal with it as they think fit.

22.—Any member having any complaint to make must send the same in writing to the committee or attend personally.

23.—The members will be allowed to practice running or other athletic sports at such times as not to interfere with the game of cricket or to damage the ground, such members practising must have proper costume.

24.—That a member shall be entitled to introduce guests to the club, but no person shall be admitted to the club as a guest more than eight times in one year. Members must accompany the guests introduced by them during the period of their stay in

the club. Every guest and the member introducing him shall, upon entering the club, sign their names in a book to be kept for this purpose. Should any such guest to the club pay for refreshments served to him he shall at once be removed from the club premises, and the member introducing such guest shall be expelled from membership on the fact being duly proved, and it shall be the duty of any officer or member of the club, becoming aware of such breach of the rules, to report it at once to the secretary or committee.

25.—That the hour of opening the club shall be 8 a.m., and closed at 12 p.m. The committee of the club shall be empowered on special occasions to vary these hours, but no variation shall take place except by a resolution of the club committee immediately preceding such extension or remission.

26.—That no rule shall be altered or rescinded or any additional

rule made unless by the consent of a majority of the members or a meeting called by the secretary on behalf of the committee, or by a requisition in writing, signed by twenty members of the club, and the terms of the rule proposed to be made, altered, or rescinded, along with the notice of such meeting, shall be posted up in the pavilion six clear days before the date of such meeting, and that the posting up in the pavilion of any such new or altered rules shall be sufficient notice to the members.

BYE-LAWS.

Non-members residing within a radius of two miles are not allowed on Sundays.
