



# Looking Back

## 1928

Elland entertained Honley on Saturday and a draw in favour of the home team was the outcome of a free-scoring game. Elland, who declared at 231—4, owed much to their captain, E. W. King, whose 103 was his second century of the season and gave him an average of 43.19. In the time remaining for play Honley lost six wickets in scoring 113. An outstanding bowling performance in Saturday's play was that of A. Noble (Thongsbridge), who had figures of 10.2—2—32—9 at Marsden.

## 1943

Tom Oldham, the young Hall Bower batsman, created a record at Hall Bower against Holmfirth that will not be broken easily. In forty-one minutes he hit up 105 runs out of a total of 139—1. In three successive overs from Noble, who bowled two of them, and Haley, Oldham and Booth hit 53 runs. Booth's share was 3. Off Haley, Oldham had three successive sixes and altogether he hit eleven sixes and seven fours.
