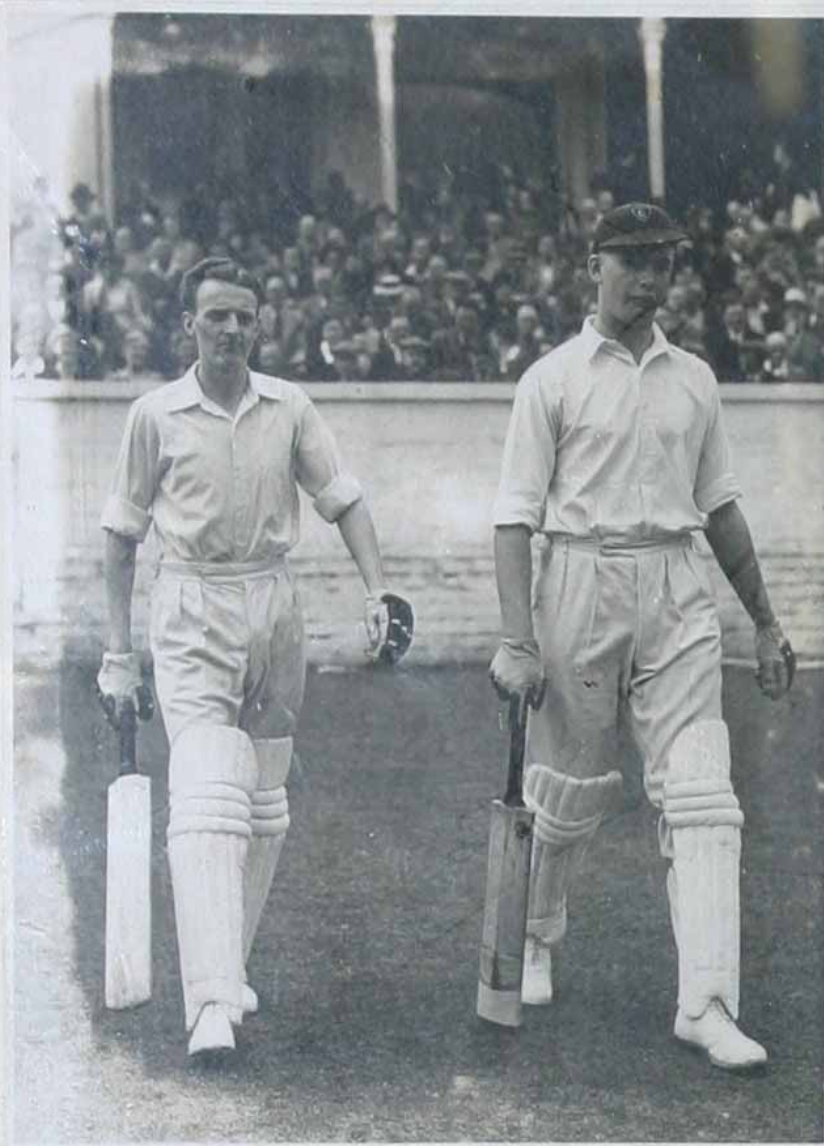

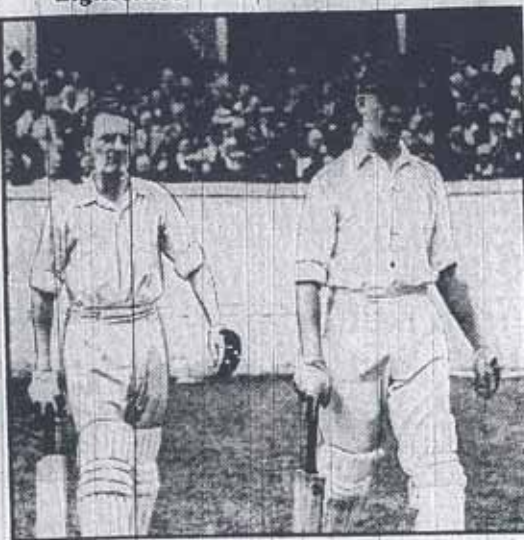

BAD LIGHT, THEN THUNDERSTORM

Lightcliffe's 102-3 in Priestley Cup Final

AFTER an appeal for bad light by the Lightcliffe batsmen had succeeded in the Priestley Cup Final against East Bierley at Park Avenue today, a thunderstorm sent spectators scurrying for shelter.

Lightcliffe had scored 102 for three before the interruption.

An opening stand of 52 gave Lightcliffe a good start, but only nine runs were added when they lost their second wicket.

Lightcliffe, who won the cup in 1926 and 1937, were without their Yorkshire colt, Bernard Brooke, who has an ankle injury; Raymond Hirst, son of Joe Hirst, who used to play with the club, joined his brother Donald in the side.

East Bierley, who have never won the cup but appeared in the final in 1930 and 1933, were at full strength.

Herbert Aspinall, who won the toss for Lightcliffe, decided to open the innings with 21-year-old Malcolm Woodcock, and neither was troubled by the fast attack of George Govier and Brian Hall.

CAUTIOUS BATTING

After 49 minutes the Australian, Len Reid, and left arm spinner, Jack Woodhead, were introduced, but Lightcliffe's batsmen batted cautiously.

The crowd of about 3,000 had to wait 50 minutes for the first boundary, and it took them 65 minutes to score 50 runs.

Only two runs were added when this partnership was broken. Woodcock, who had scored 25, turned the ball to leg and Richardson made a catch behind the wicket.

At 58, Aspinall tried to drive Woodhead, to the boundary but Grant took the ball at mid-off.

SMITH MADE AMENDS

Govier displaced Reid at the football stand end, but Smith and Booth lifted the score to 89 before they were separated.

At 87, when Smith had scored 21, Hall dropped an easy catch on the boundary edge, but two runs later, when he took over from Govier, he made amends for his fielding error by beating Smith.

Albert Hartley, Lightcliffe's professional for 25 years, sent the hundred up after 125 minutes, and with the score at 102 for three, an appeal for bad light by the Lightcliffe batsmen was granted. Five minutes later, a thunderstorm sent spectators hurrying for shelter.

Lightcliffe had still 30min. to bat before their innings was suspended.

**SURPRISE IN WHITE CITY
SPORTS**

There was an early surprise in the international triangular athletics match between combined England-Wales and Scotland and Ireland teams at the White City London, today.

When the field of eight began their attempt on the 3-mile walking record held by Harry Churcher (Great Britain) in 33min. 33.3sec. Roland Hardy, the Sheffield United harrier and finalist of the A.A.A. seven and two miles titles, had not gone 50yd. when he was ruled out by the judges for not walking correctly.

Hardy and his club mate Lawrence Allen, are members of the British team for the European games at Brussels.

Hardy immediately took the lead, and was several yards in front of his nearest rivals when he was pulled out.

Churcher, who has been suffering from a recent ankle injury, was a non-starter.

The meeting attracted a very large attendance. The weather was favourable for fast times.

Allen eventually won in 35min 40.8sec., failing to break Churcher's record.

Allen tried hard in the last mile to pick up time and was helped by his rivals who, although lapped, waited for him and tried to speed it up.

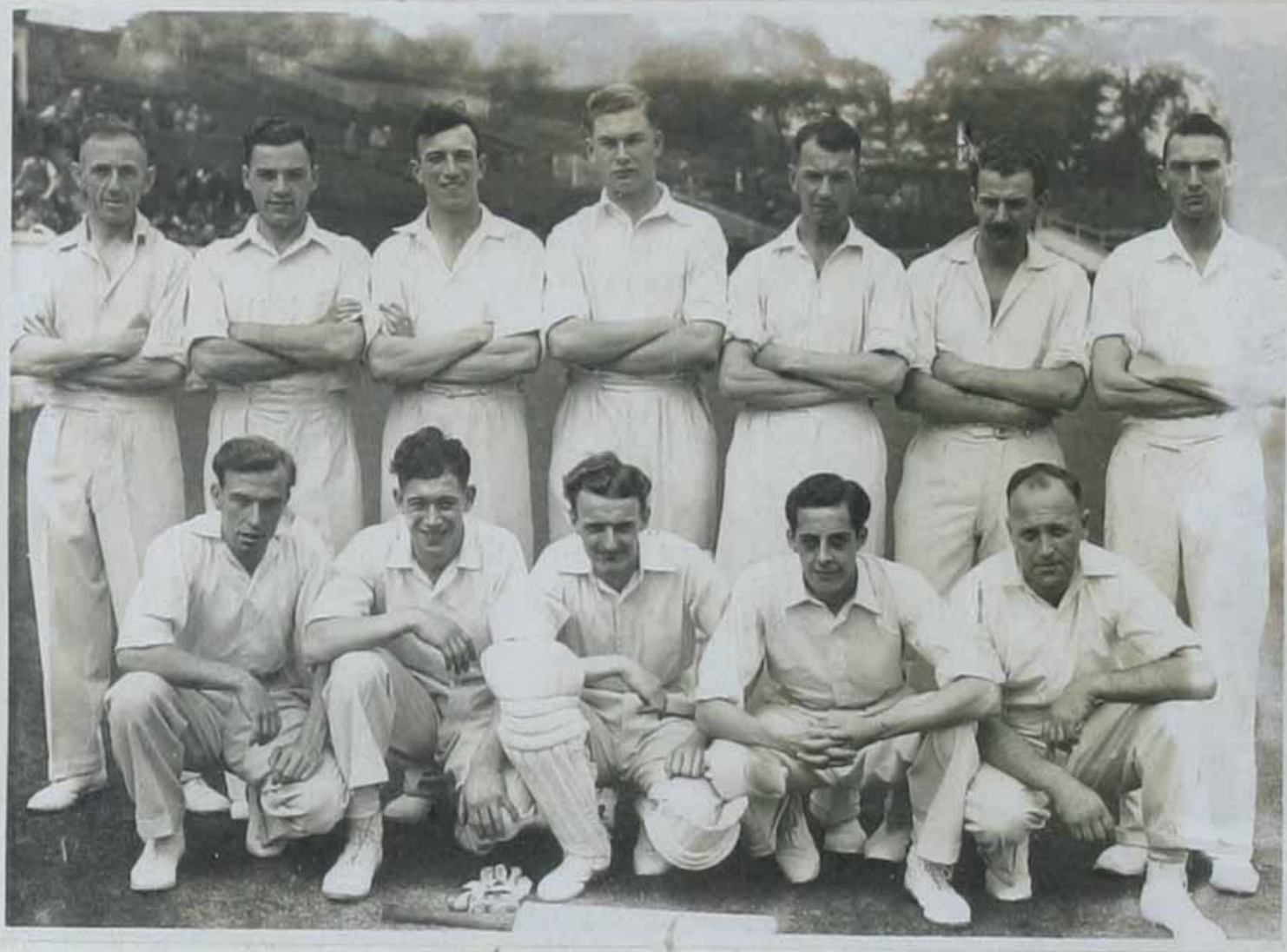
