

Memorandum of Agreement made on
twenty fifth day of March one thousand eight
hundred and eighty one Between John
Scott of Far End Howley in the County of York
of the one part and John Alfred Jones, Arthur
Heap, Charles Wall, Richard Henry Hardy, John
Richard Thornton and Joe Robinson all of
Howley aforesaid (hereinafter called the
said Lessees) of the other part whereby the
said John Scott agrees to let and the said
Lessees agree to take all that field situate
at Far End aforesaid and now used as a
Cricket Field by the Howley Cricket Club for
the term of one year certain from the first
day of November last and so on from year
to year during the occupation by the said
John Scott of the farm of which the said
field forms part, at the yearly rent of Ten
pounds payable by equal half yearly
payments during the first week in May
and November in each year the first of
such payments to be made during the
first week in May next. The said Lessees
to have power to determine the said term
at any time by giving six calendar months
notice in writing to the said John Scott
of their intention so to do. The said Lessees
to keep in good repair during the said
tenancy all the fences of the said field
and the said John Scott agrees that
during the said term he will pay all
rates taxes and other assessments in
respect of the said field, and that
whenever he gives or receives a notice to
quit the said farm he will forthwith
give notice to the said Lessees or some or



one of them that he has given or
received such notice as aforesaid. In
