



### Renovation of Tea Hut.

Mr.C.Spencer reported that a Mr.C.English had inspected the Tea Hut and had estimated that the cost of materials for the renovation work required would amount to £8. Bearing in mind the additional cost of labour, it was agreed that Mr.Spencer should arrange for the work to be carried out by Mr.English up to a maximum cost of £12.

### Payment of Talent Money to Players.

Details of the present scales of Talent Money payable to 1st Eleven Amateurs only were revealed by the Treasurer as follows:-

Batsmen	Bowlers
20 - 29 Runs 5/-	3 Wickets 7/6d
30 - 39 7/6d	4 10/-
40 - 49 12/6d	5 15/-
50 & over 15/-	6 & over 20/-

It was proposed by Mr.P.Ellis and seconded by Mr.E.Loader that the amounts of 15/- for 50 Runs and over and 20/- for 6 wickets and over should not be paid in instances where collections taken up exceeded these amounts but collections which did not reach these amounts should be made up to them. A further proposition was tabled by Mr.W.Lawton and seconded by Mr.C.Brook that the other payments already in force should continue next season whilst an amendment was proposed by Mr.C.Spencer and seconded by Mr.P.Ellis that they should be amended as follows:-

Voting duly took place and the amendment was defeated by 6 votes to 4. A further proposition was tabled by Mr.C.Spencer, seconded by Mr.E.Loader and unanimously agreed that Talent Money should be paid to members of the Second XI at the rate of 10/- for either 50 Runs or 6 Wickets. Chairman Mr.J.P.Burnhill suggested the award of a Fielding Prize for both the 1st & 2nd XIs. The amount in each case to be the same £2.2s.0d to be presented at the end of each season based on weekly reports given by the respective Captains. Professionals and the Wicket-Keepers were eligible for this award. The motion was formally moved by Mr.P.Ellis seconded by Mr.F.Camp and unanimously agreed.

### Rep's Report on Central Yorkshire League Meeting.

Mr.W.Lawton delivered his report on the business conducted at the last meeting of the Central Yorkshire League but there was nothing directly concerning the Club.

### Any other Business

The Secretary handed over to the Treasurer an amount of 35/- received from Battyeford Wanderers F.C. as a donation in respect of their Field being cut by Mr.Hurst Barber who had suggested this instead of accepting a fee for his services. Mr.C.Spencer reported that he was still not in a position to deal with this matter owing to the fact that a large quantity of seats had been stored in the Tea Hut by the Groundsmen at the Memorial Ground, presumably without permission of the Club. Mr.J.Allen stated that he had drawn the attention of Parks Supt Mr.E.C.Taylor to this fact whereupon Mr.Taylor had immediately given an undertaking to have these removed upon request. Discussion followed but the suggestion of writing a letter of protest to the Council was finally discounted in favour of the matter being left in the hands of Mr.J.Allen to arrange for the seats being removed through the Parks Supt. at a time convenient to Mr.C.Spencer who would then be able to proceed with his original intention of securing an estimate for the renovation work involved.

### Players for 1964 - Latest Developments.

Reference to the terms of engagement of All Rounder Barry Wood and newcomer Wicket-Keeper Colin Beaumont, the engagement of Geoff.Slingsby as an Amateur and the departure of Colin Peacock and Geoff.Hodgson has already been made in these Minutes. Mr.G.Arran announced that he had invited another newcomer, namely Mr.J.Wakefield, a batsman who has played with Partown to join us next season, an invitation which had tentatively been accepted. The Secretary was instructed to confirm this invitation by letter to the Player c/o V.E.B., Market St., Huddersfield.

### Nomination of 2nd XI Umpire

It was announced by Mr.G.Arran that one of the three nominees previously referred to, namely Mr.Pyrhah had withdrawn and this left us with Messrs.J.Heyes and A.Pretwell, which were proposed by Messrs.H.Holmes and C.Spencer and seconded by Messrs.J.Hardy and G.Arran respectively. Voting duly took place and Mr.J.Heyes was nominated by 8 Votes to 4 and he would therefore officiate as Umpire for all 2nd Eleven League Matches for our Club next Season.

### Delegate's Report on C.Y.L. Business.

Mr.W.Lawton delivered his report on the recent meeting of the C.Y.L. held in Dewsbury. The main item concerned the application to join the League by new Club Hunslet Nelson and whether in the event of them and another new Club being admitted in the future, Clubs would prefer this rather than Inter-Divisional fixtures. A vote on this was taken and it was established that we would prefer the new Clubs.

### Any other Business

Treasurer Mr.H.Holmes announced that he had received a donation of 3 Gns from Mr.Richard Goodall who had passed this on to Mr.J.Hardy upon reading in the Press that the Club's financial position was not all that it should be. This was gratefully received and had been suitably acknowledged in writing by Mr.Hardy. The Secretary was requested to write a letter of thanks to Mr.Charles Buckley in respect of a set of Cricket stumps which he had given to the Club. The question of the promotion of a Celebration Dinner or Dinner Dance was discussed and it was finally resolved that Mr.Hurst Barber should approach the Management at the Three Buns Inn with regard to the possibility of convening a Dinner there on a suitable Monday evening in March, 1964.
