LEAGUE DISCIPLINE CODE

Clubs must take adequate steps to ensure the good behaviour of their players, officials, members and supporters towards other players and officials, including verbal and written communications.

The Management Committee will not tolerate indiscipline and severe action will be taken for any breach of the Rules of the League.

In 1997 the Management Committee introduced a Discipline Code for players that prescribed fixed penalties for certain kinds of offence. This was essentially for administrative convenience to avoid unnecessary disciplinary hearings where a player had no wish to challenge the charge(s) made against him.

During the nine years of operation experience has shown that the relative seriousness of offences within categories varies widely and that a standard penalty in all cases may not be appropriate. In addition the dividing line between different categories of offence has sometimes seemed more apparent than real.

In cases reported by umpires the Disciplinary Administrator will implement one of the following procedures:

- 1) For less serious, but nevertheless unacceptable, offences (e.g. ungentlemanly conduct, dissent etc) he will after assessing the report(s) and consulting senior League officers notify any penalty to the player via his club secretary. The notification will however, as previously, emphasise that the player may on receipt opt for a personal hearing by the Disciplinary Sub Committee under Rule L11c). Should this option be taken the player has, in addition, a right of appeal under Rule L11g) against any decision of that Sub Committee.
- 2) Cases of a more serious nature (e.g. persistent intimidation of an opposing player, foul & abusive language, violent behaviour, racial abuse etc) will, following assessment of the report(s), be referred to either the Disciplinary Sub-Committee or the Management Committee as appropriate. As 1) above the player has the right of appeal against any decision taken by either of the two bodies.

Any period of suspension imposed under these procedures will automatically be doubled should the same player commit a further offence within a three-year period from the start of the suspension for the original offence.

Captains are reminded, under the Spirit of Cricket, that they have a duty to their club, to the League, and not least of all to themselves, to ensure that they control their players and help to eradicate the unacceptable action of the small idiot minority.
