MATTERS ARISING:

- 1) Re bulk purchase of cricket balls. Mr. Russell Murphy has 1000 balls and has offered 2 on free trial. C.A.B suggested they be used at the next indoor net and it was agreed that the 1st team captain be given the power to act on the result of their performance.
- 2) Re alarm. Ace Security had been removed from the police's approved list and were not recommended by the CPO. It was prop. GMA sec. JPH that 3 quotes be obtained from suggested companies on the approved list for a key operated system. Passed unanimously.
Prop TR sec JPH that no Ace Security bills be settled in the meantime. Passed unanimously.

Certain items had been increased in price by the brewery. Prop by LM that these be passed straight on to the customer immediately.

LEAGUE REPS REPORTS: No meeting.

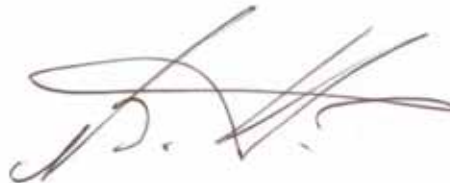
CONVENERS REPORTS

AW reported that the cutter had been serviced and returned and the big machine and rotary mower were now away. The Bowling Club had borrowed the scarrifier & he suggested this should be at no cost. Agreed with 1 against.
JPH said that Mr. W Allott & Mr. Ogden were prepared to work on the ground.
BL is looking at the roller and a skip is required before the season begins.
