 R. Bellwell } That we don't bother with a Social this time
 but that 3 of a deputation see the President
 & have a proper understanding as to whether we
 are considered outsiders or what it means. According
 to this proposition W. D. Worth, J. Huxtable & Secretary

one fourth of the whole club including themselves.
(b) Such members shall not be eligible for any office (but may serve on the Committee) but in other respects are entitled to the same privileges as those who are Scholars & members of the Congregation.

(6) That all Officers of the Club except President & Vice Presidents (who shall be ex-officio members of the Committee) to be elected by ballot at the October Annual Meetings & all vacancies arising may be filled up by the Committee.

(7) All new members shall be elected by the Committee, such election, to be by ballot. (one black ball in four to exclude). The names of those seeking election must be proposed & seconded by members of the club in writing & posted in the Cricket Tent & Church Institute for ten days before the election, the ten days to include two consecutive Saturdays.

(8) That no challenge be given or accepted except through the Secretary & all matches to be decided by the Committee by whom the teams shall also be selected.

(9) That members who have been selected to play in a match, absconding themselves without a satisfactory reason (& notifying the same to the secretary at least one whole day before the day of the match) shall be dealt with as the Committee may think proper.

(10) That a friend not being an inhabitant of the parish, introduced by a member may be allowed to play with the same privilege, unless objected to by a majority of the members present.

(11) That any member conducting himself improperly, either by word or deed, (being reported to the Committee) & duly cautioned shall persist in such conduct, shall be dealt with as they may determine, either by fines or expulsion.

(12) Any member refusing or omitting to pay a fine or fines after having received due notice shall be dealt with by the Committee. Also any member disqualifying himself shall be dealt with by the Committee.

(13) That no one shall be eligible for any prize who has not played in half the matches played, & that no one shall be eligible for the Bowling Prize who has not bowled 25 overs & played in half the matches played.

(14) That for 3 wickets taken with successive balls in one over & for 50 Runs obtained in an Innings the player shall receive 5/- to be paid by the members taking part in the match.

(15) That if a Batter retire before he is out, unless he be injured or the last wicket has fallen, it shall count as a completed Innings, and in any match where a dispute arises the match be stopped the scores shall not count in the averages.

(16) That the Bats &c may be taken out at any time when 3 members ^{or more} are present, those ^{two} who last out of them Innings shall be held responsible for their safe return & safely locked up.

(17) That none of these Rules shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the Club.

(18) That in case of the dissolution of the Club, the Cricket Club, Bats & other material belonging to it, shall become the property of the Allington Church Sunday School.

New 13
April 3rd
1903
That no player shall be eligible for any prize who has not played in half the matches played. No player shall be eligible for the Bowling prize who has taken less than 25 wickets with the 1st & 20 wickets with the 2nd & 1st appeared in half the matches played (no of out wickets to play the highest proportion to count)

New Rule 4
or alteration
Oct 27 1903
That the subscription of a following member be that
all persons over 21 years of age pay a subscription of 6/- ^{per} year
" 16 years & under 21 years " of 5/-
" under 16 years " of 2/-

& shall become due each year on the 1st of May. Any member who has omitted to pay his subscriptions within 3 months after it is due (having received notice from the Secretary to do so) shall be considered a non member & on his re-entering a shilling entrance fee be demanded together with arrears.
