Test star James Anderson has written the foreword to a new book about the history of Burnley Cricket Club.

The Lancashire and England fast bowler learnt his trade at Turf Moor - and says that the club played a massive role in his development.

The book is entitled *You Couldn't Make It Up!* and it tells the story of Burnley CC from formation in 1834 to the present day.

Author Tony Lister is an ex-player and lifelong fan of the club - and the book is the product of years of research.

"I've been following the club since I was young," said Tony, "and I wanted to chronicle its ups and downs since the early days".

Tony lives in Portsmouth but still has strong connections with his home town.

"I've still got family and friends in Burnley. Writing the book was a labour of love and I enjoyed putting it all together."

The 184-page book is illustrated throughout, covers all the main eras in the club's history, and also contains a statistics section.
