Armitage replaced Colbeck, and with steady run getting provided support for Leadbeater who played an absolutely superb innings of 105, and although he was out a few runs short of the target, victory was assured, and Ramsden was able to complete the picture without difficulty. It has been recorded as one of the most interesting and exciting finals in the history of the competition.
