1983 Sykes Cup Final

ELLAND who have lifted the Sykes Cup more than any other club regained the trophy with a five wicket win over Honley last night — but had only three balls to spare.

In a tense and always closely fought final, Honley — who had won the competition for the first time last year — found that even good performances by each of the three Hinchliffe brothers in their side were not enough.

Darren Hinchliffe scored a solid 38 in Honley's 192-6 in 45 overs.

Elland, playing on their home ground, reached victory off the third ball of the final over, with all their wickets being taken by either Jamie or Alan Hinchliffe.

Honley, who batted first after winning the toss had an early blow when their captain Jake-man was out for a duck at three. It was then left to Rimmington and Darren Hinchliffe to repair the innings with a stand of 82.

When Hinchliffe went, opener Rimmington — who totted up a brave 53 — was joined by veteran Bocarro, who was eventually run out for 71, which included three sixes and five fours.

Elland, who had won the competition on a record breaking nine previous occasions could never be sure of overcoming the Honley total especially when Bradley went for five with 19 scored.

Alan Hinchliffe dismissed both Elland openers — Bradley and Blakey — but a stand of 97 between White who scored 75 in 110 minutes and Webster (47) put Elland on their way to victory.

AN outstanding 6-50 in 23 overs by off-spinner White steered Menston to a deserved Waddilove Cup success when they beat Skipton by 25 runs in the final at Otley yesterday.

White, in his younger days a pace bowler with Undercliffe, not surprisingly gained the Player of the Match Award in a final which, sponsored by the Skipton Building Society, yielded record receipts.

Menston were in dire trouble when, as a result of some excellent bowling by Skipton's Australian spinner Judd, they slumped to 102-7. However, with Smith making a quick 48 and captain Thackeray (28), lending good support, Menston reached 168.

It seemed Skipton's challenge had ended when they lost their first four wickets for only 30, but Robinson and Hedges launched a splendid recovery and with three overs remaining Skipton had an outside chance of scoring the 39 they still needed for victory.

White struck again however, with three quick wickets, and Menston duly completed their first success in the competition since 1951.
