

# HONLEY AND HEADINGLEY

## IAN HARVEY PROFILE BY CRAIG BAMFORD

Ian Harvey is another great Australian cricketer who settled in England and developed in the English game. He is also another cricketer to play for Honley Cricket Club.



Like many other Aussie cricketers, Harvey started out playing for his home state, Victoria, in 1993 as an all-rounder.

After some great seasons there he hit the international scene and made his ODI debut for his country in 1997, and ended up with 73 caps.

Harvey established himself as a hard-hitting batsman but did not score any 50s in his ODI career.

Despite being dropped from the ODI side because of his batting ability, Harvey was a tight end-of-innings bowler with a well disguised slower ball.

His inconsistent style of play did not help his international career but he did represent his country at the World Cup in South Africa.

And at present he is the highest-capped ODI player without a Test cap under his belt.

Between 1999 and 2003 he played county cricket for Gloucestershire and was a key player in the team that won a number of one-day titles.

Harvey was also the first player to hit a century in Twenty20 cricket, in 2003, and also scored another two centuries in that form of the game.

In 2004 Harvey moved to Headingley to play for follow County Championship side Yorkshire.

2007 saw a move to Derbyshire but he failed to play a full season with the club as his clearance to play as an English-qualified cricketer was not granted.
