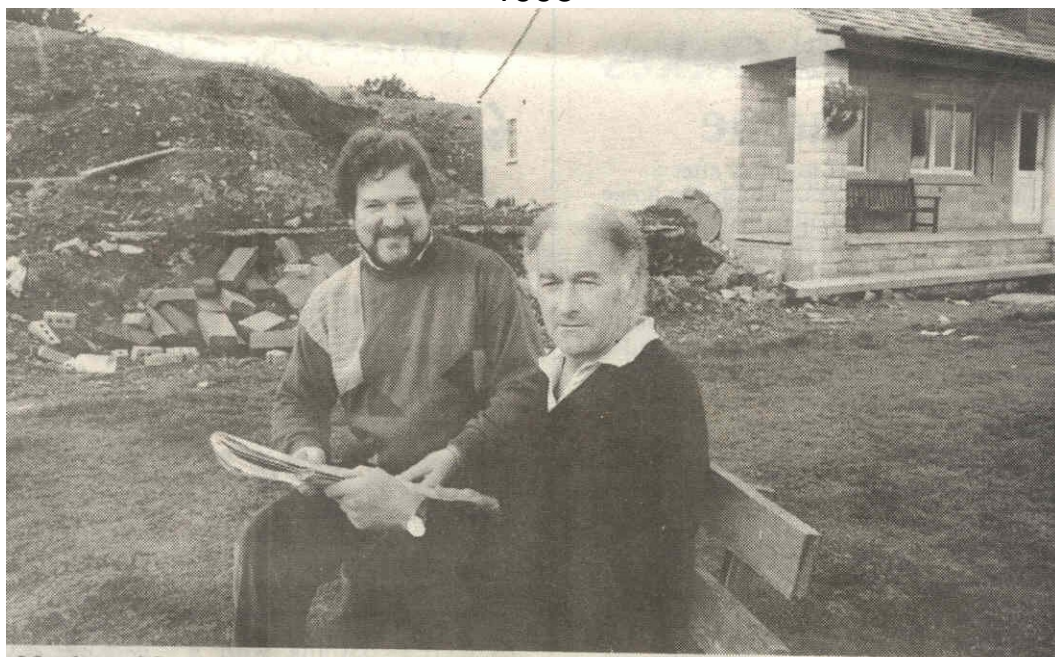


# NIGEL SENIOR

Members of Cumberworth Cricket Club discuss plans to turn a heap of debris into a work of art. A public meeting is planned at Cumberworth First School on Friday at 7.45pm to discuss the plans to create the *Cumberworth Steppes* out of the spoil heap formed 100 years ago when the Cumberworth railway tunnel was created.

plans to terrace the heap as the sixth in the series of 12 landmarks being created around the 72-mile circular Kirklees Walk.

The project is being carried out by Wakefield-based arts consultancy Public Arts in conjunction with a local group.

The spoil heap is alongside the cricket club's new £55,000 pavilion, built to replace one which burned down in August. The pavilion has been partly funded by a grant of more than £30,000 from the national lottery.
