The reasons are as follows :-

- ③ Being very central for the villages of Ovenden, Bradshaw, Bixenden & Holmfild
- ④ That the Allengworth Club being one of the oldest in the Borough of Halifax (if not the oldest) look upon it as their duty to take this action.

Our application for admittance to the "Yorkshire Cricket Council" has been accepted on conditions that we alter our Ground & Dressing accommodation which will entail an outlay of upwards of £200.

The Committee make an appeal to the Sporting instinct of the District for this amount in anticipation of their kind & liberal support & beg to thank you for any little assistance you will give us.

We also got as far as the Semi Final in the Knock out  
competition for the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Cunner Cup having to admit  
defeat to Mytholmroyd <sup>by 5 runs</sup> after an afternoon of very trying conditions.

### 3 November Committee Meeting
