New Road C.C.

Annual Dinner and Meeting

The annual dinner and general meeting of the Rastrick New-road Sunday School Cricket Club took place yesterday evening week. The dinner was provided and served by the Brighthouse Co-operative Society, whose catering was highly commended. Coun. A. Reeve (president) presided.

Mr. H. Walker (secretary), in his annual report, said that New-road had slightly improved on the performances of the previous year. Financially they were in much the same position as last year. Two fielding prizes had been awarded, and this small encouragement had greatly improved the fielding. The first eleven had played 20 League matches, but unfortunately only one cup-tie. Five matches were won, seven lost, nine drawn. The total number of runs scored was 1,390 for the loss of 134 wickets, an average of slightly over 10 runs per wicket. Their opponents had scored 1,416 runs for 116 wickets, an average of about 12 per wicket. Albert Bottomley had again the highest aggregate with 174 runs, but Arnold Bottomley headed the batting with an average of 15. In the bowling department, A. P. Atkinson had most wickets, but N. Wood headed the average list. The second team had done better than the seniors, for of the 32 games played in League and Cup they had won nine, lost seven and drawn six. E. Armitage had scored most runs with an aggregate of 142, but L. Saunders had the best average with 15 per innings. Bowling honours were divided between W. Hanson, E. Armitage and H. Keene, the first-named heading the list. The fielding prizes had been won by A. Sutcliffe and H. Walker.

Mr. E. Holdsworth (treasurer), submitted the financial statement. Quite apart from the ordinary accounts, £3 12s. 6d. had been handed over to the Lump Cup Infirmary Fund, the result of an evening match at Round Hill. Last year there was a credit balance of nearly £18, and this year's balance was £19 10s. 8d.

In moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet, Coun. Reeve remarked that New-road was in a much better financial position than some of the senior clubs of the district.

It was decided to again play an evening match to augment the Lump Cup Infirmary Fund.

Coun. Reeve was again unanimously elected president and in returning thanks, remarked that he was proud to be associated with the New-road club, where they kept up the best traditions of the game.

Other officers elected were: Vice-presidents, Mr. J. W. Bottomley and Mr. J. H. Ramsden; secretary, Mr. Harold Walker; treasurer, Mr. Edgar Holdsworth; committee, Messrs. F. R. Berry, P. Bottomley, R. Firth, J. Garside, J. Booth, H. Sutcliffe, A. Walker, Albert Bottomley, L. Saunders, A. P. Atkinson, S. Squire, A. Sutcliffe, E. Berry, P. Sutcliffe, P. Hanson, L. Durrance, W. Hanson; auditors, Mr. J. W. Bottomley and Mr. G. F. Crowther; selection committee, Messrs. W. Thorpe, E. Holdsworth, J. Garside, P. Henson, T. Marsden, F. R. Berry and H. Armitage; League representative, Mr. E. Berry.
