to £50 in the Pavilion scheme without prior approval  
from the full Committee.

## 1976 (25 Nov) Social & Finance Committee

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE SOCIAL & FINANCE COMMITTEE  
held in the Pavilion on the 25th Nov.76 at 8.15 p.m.

Mr.Schofield in the Chair.

The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting and these were passed as a true record.

### ANNUAL DINNER DANCE.

The Chairman stated that this was a success, the meal and disco being very good indeed. The Treasurer gave the Committee the following figures. Total receipts £429.40, expenses£14.61, profit £14.79.

Several complaints however were voiced by the committee these being:-

1. No bar facilities between 7.00 and 8.00 p.m.
2. Cloak rooms being very dirty.
3. No heating in the room at all.

The Secretary was instructed to write to Elland C.C. listing these complaints and asking them to comment on them.

### INSURANCE.

The Treasurer reported that the club was not covered to the standard that the Committee had requested, this included cover for people working behind the bar and public liability to the sum of £250,000.

The Chairman thanked the Treasurer on behalf of the Club for his efforts in getting the insurance cover into being.

### GROUND MAINTENANCE.

R. Oates said that the Club had bought a new mower at a cost of £110 and had traded an old one in for £10.

### VENTILATION TO BAR.

The President reported that the new system seemed to be working quite well although it might be necessary to fix a flap over the fan to ensure that too much heat was not drawn out. He also pointed out that the work had been done by club members at a cost of approx. £50 instead of the estimated £800 by outside contractor.

### BUILDING EXTENSION.

V. Wadsworth said that the builders were due to start on the front porch next week. The Secretary was asked to contact Graham Kilburn to see what progress had been made on the plans for other extensions.

### TREASURER'S REPORT.

The Treasurer reported that the hire charge for the rotor-rake had been fixed at £15. Bar billiards had produced a profit of

£30 since instalment. The bar was making approx. £100 a month nett profit. He thought that the club would probably be able to leave subs. the same as they are now. He also said that he would like to thank Mr.J.Rothwell for collecting the monies for the Dinner and Dance. He reported that we had not yet paid off the outstanding debt on the loan and it was proposed by J. Buckwell, seconded J. Holroyd that this be paid off by the end of the year - carried.

Bar prices had had to be increased to keep in line with the increased brewers charges.

The sweep which had been run during the season by B.Crabtree and B.Tennyson had made a profit of £97.

#### WASTE PAPER.

Mr.Wadsworth stated that arrangements had been made for the waste paper to be cleared from the old pavilion on Sunday 5th Dec. The Secretary was asked to put a notice on the board asking for volunteers to help.

#### DOGS.

Several members brought up the subject of people exercising dogs in the field and quite a bit of damage had been done to the newly seeded wicket. It was pointed out that the field had been treated with various fertilizers some of which were harmful to animals. After discussion it was agreed that notices be posted to this effect. Mr.J.Barron agreed to obtain the notices, Mr.V. Wadsworth agreed to post them.

It was also agreed that members be requested not to bring dogs into the pavilion.

The Secretary was instructed to post notices to this effect but to leave it until one could be posted in the new porch.

#### TYRES FOR TRACTOR.

Mr. Wadsworth reported that the tractor needed new tyres considering that it would be needed for pulling the gang mowers. It was proposed by J. Buckwell seconded J. Rothwell that the tyres be bought - carried.

DATE FOR A.G.M. This was fixed for the first Tuesday in February.

#### PHOTOS

After discussion it was agreed that Mr.B. Crabtree would try and arrange to have all the team photographs cut to the same size and when this was done arrangements would be made to have them mounted on the end wall of the bar.

#### NEW YEARS EVE.

B. Crabtree said he would prepare some new tapes suitable for the occasion. It was agreed to run a Mr.& Mrs.Competition

and Phillip Rothwell agreed to make the posters for this.

There being no other business the chairman declared the meeting closed at 9.45 p.m.
