

The pavilion was opened in 1950 before being redeveloped in 1997 and is a perfect location to watch the action from and enjoy a refreshing drink.

The scoreboard is a small, square construction situated in the corner of the ground by the pavilion.



High Lee Green is 205 metres/673 feet above sea level and is one of the highest in the area. It is beautifully maintained.

Local housing: lucky local residents have an ideal view of the ground.

Countryside: the ground is situated high up in the Upper Calder Valley and is surrounded by rolling hills and picturesque views.



Sightscreens: these are important as they allow the batsmen to gain a clear view of the ball.
