## Profile of Ronnie Hart by Ashley Ball



The right-handed Kiwi made an impression with bat as well as behind the stumps and was also known to have a bowl, yet he only represented his native country on one occasion in a one day international.

Ronald Terence Hart was born in Lower Hutt, Wellington, in 1961. In New Zealand he played for both his hometown side Wellington and Central Districts.

In his one appearance for New Zealand he scored a disappointing 3 runs against the West Indies at St. John's, Antigua, in 1985. He was never to be called up again.

Hart managed well over 2,500 first-class runs from just 51 matches; this left him with a respectable batting average of 29.51. Hart was very much an emergency bowler and he failed to claim a wicket in first class games; however, he did gain one dismissal in a List A game. His bowling style was off-break.

His time in local cricket came at Gomersal CC.
