Bulldozer at work on cricket field *15 Sept 1967*



Work was started on the levelling and remaking of the New Road Sunday School Cricket Club ground off New Hey Road, Rastrick, a week ago. The work of levelling the field had been delayed by a proposal from the West Riding County Council to send a link road for a new motorway through the field. Now that this idea has been abandoned, the cricket club have had permission from their landlord, the Thornhill Estate Co., to go ahead with the alterations.

The land on which the cricket club has its ground has now been taken by them on a 20-year lease, and they have an option to renew the lease at the end of the period. The club has been playing on the ground for 100 years.

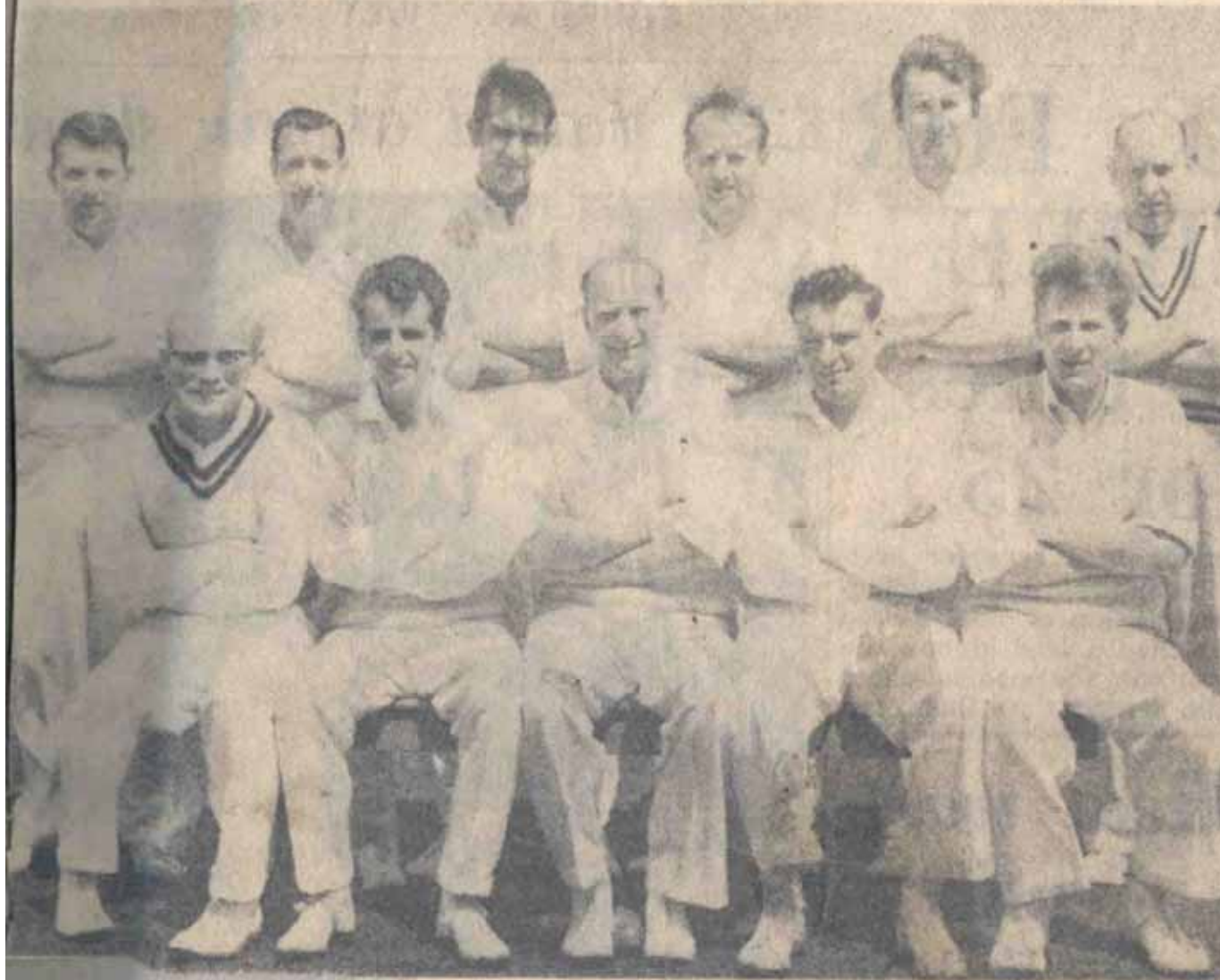
The club has been a member of

the Huddersfield and District Cricket Association for 42 years, and was a member of the Sheepridge and District League until it closed. The ground is played on every Saturday during the season.
