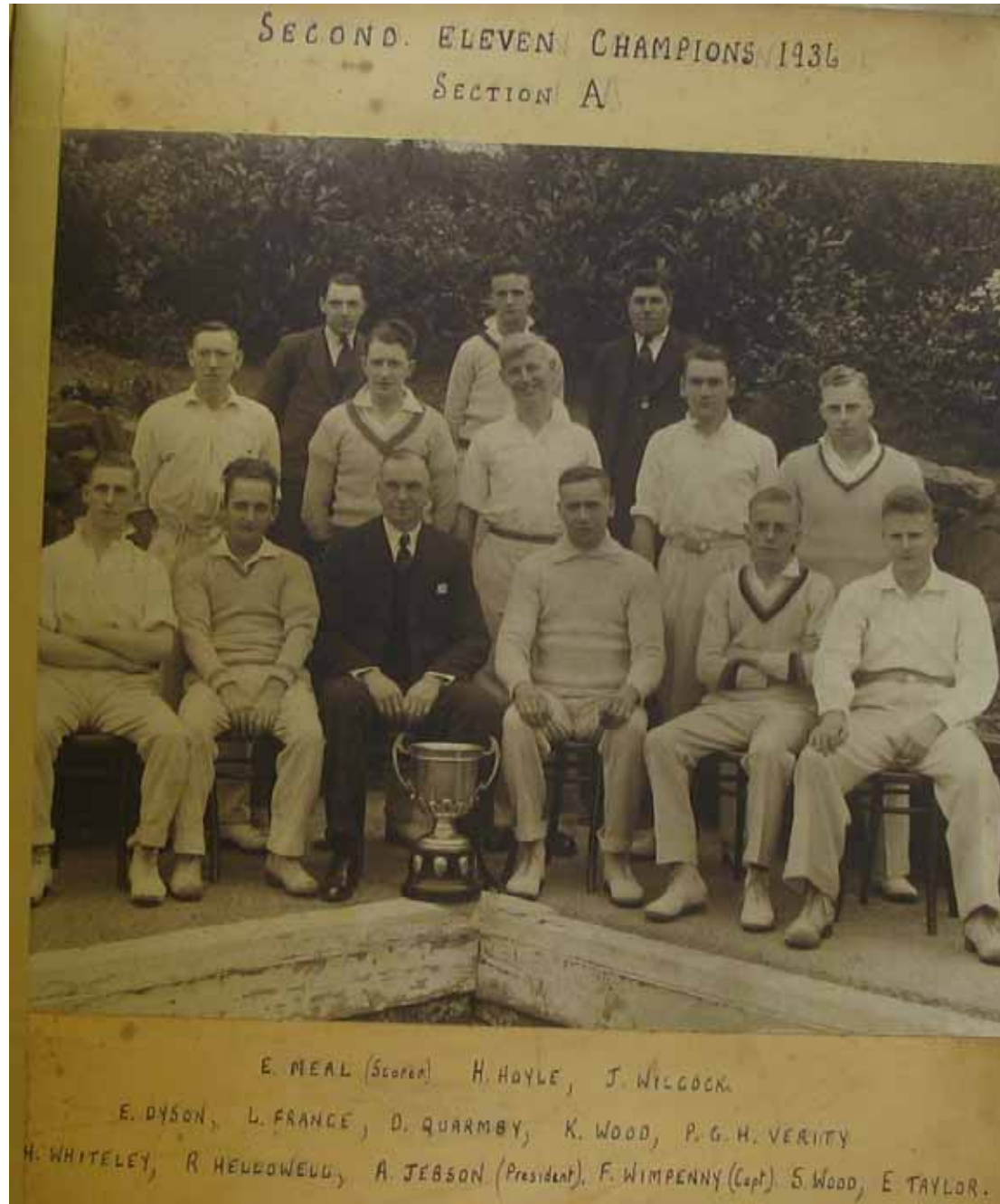

Moved on the motion of J. Eastwood, sec. by J. Japson, that D. Beaumont &

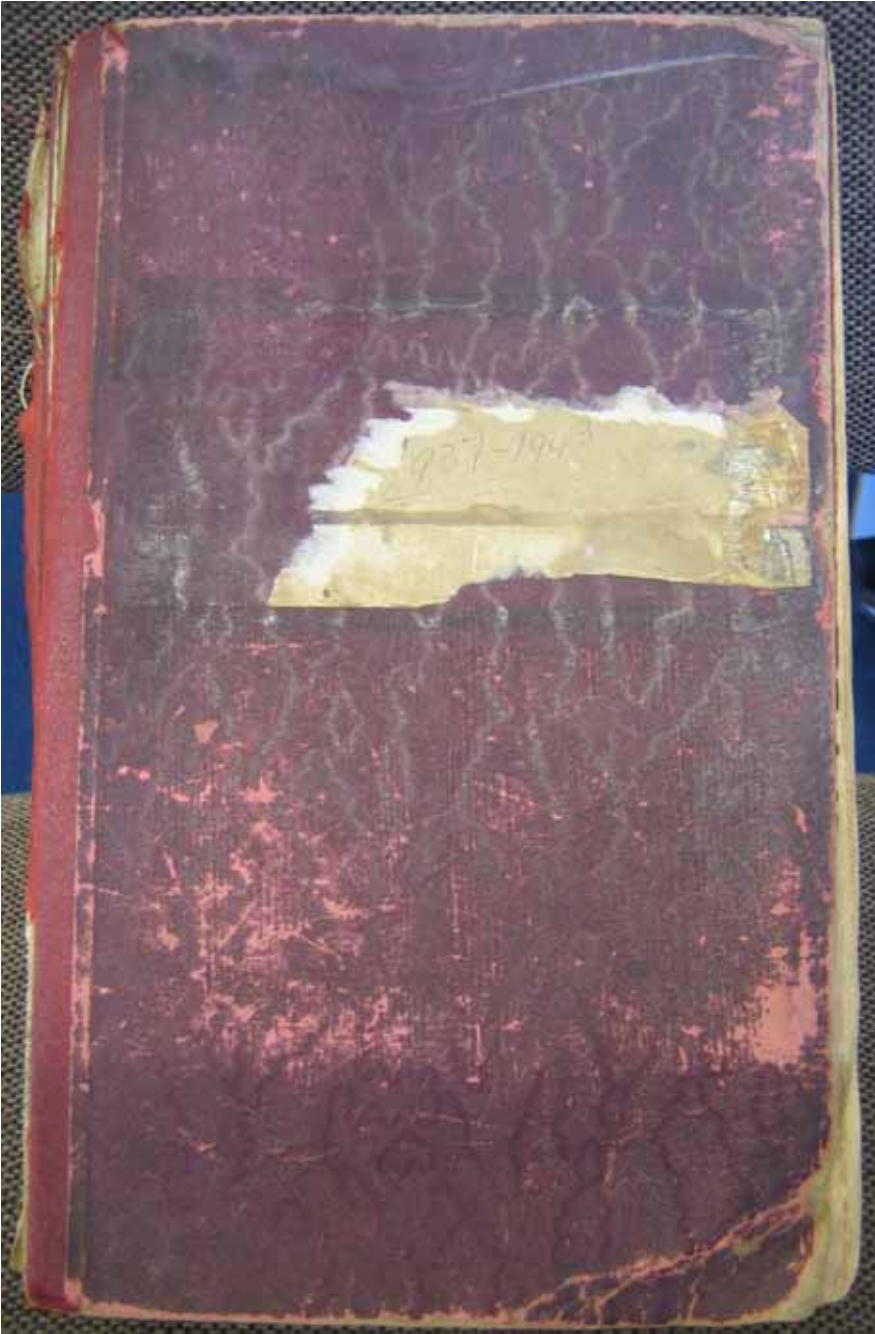

# THE ANNUAL REPORT

For the Year ending October 31st, 1937.

### Fellow Members,

The Committee have pleasure in again submitting to you the Annual Report and Balance Sheet and trust these will meet with your approval.

The year 1936-37 has been one of the best for some time past and has closed with a balance on the Credit side of £96 7s 8½d.

The Committee would be pleased to receive their appreciation of the splendid response to the public appeal for subscriptions to the Building Fund, which has now reached a total of £281 14s 6d. The total cost of the extension was £300 0s 0d, and after applying the "Wilt" England bequest there is still required the sum of £19 4s 6d. to clear the amount expended. It is earnestly hoped that this will be finally disposed of by further donations, and for this purpose the fund will remain open.

We heartily congratulate Clifford Walker, who has established himself as an opening batsman, and rounded off a good season by winning the League Batting Prize. It is interesting to note that this prize has never come to Slaithwaite since it was won by Harry Eagland in 1899, the year of its inauguration. We hope that Clifford's success will prove to be merely a stepping stone in his climb to further honours.

Interest in the under 14 Competitions for the "C. V. Gledhill Cup" is well maintained, and the games are producing a vastly improved class of cricket.

Apart from the winning of the Schweppes Cup our teams have had only a moderate season, but we have the satisfaction of having made steps in the building up of a sound team by the advancement of young players.

We have not yet engaged a Professional for 1938 but the matter has been foremost in our minds for some considerable time.

The new Treasurer has already proved an asset as evidenced by the increased patronage during the season, and in this respect we tender our grateful thanks to those Lady Members who assist in this department throughout the summer.

We have again to report the depletion of our ranks by death, and to the relatives of the following we would express our sincere sympathies: Messrs. Ben Sykes Bamforth, a Vice President, who had a long association with the Club in various capacities; John Willie Whiteley; Charlie Hirst; Fred Armitage; John William Pogson; Joseph Arkroyd; Annie Garrick; John Sykes and Willie Booth.

There are still a number of subscriptions in arrears, and it is hoped that this remark will serve as a reminder to those who have not already paid, otherwise their names must be removed from the books to comply with the Registration Act. The total membership is 600.

### BOWLING SECTION.

The Bowlers have had a very moderate season, their nearest approach to success being in the Colne Valley League. They succeeded in reaching the final, but unfortunately came off second best.

Mrs. John Bamforth's Prize and Interspersed Handicap was won by Mr. Hilton Eagland; The Denton Cup by Mr. W. E. Walker; and the Club Handicap by Mr. Edward Mellor, to all of whom we offer our congratulations.
