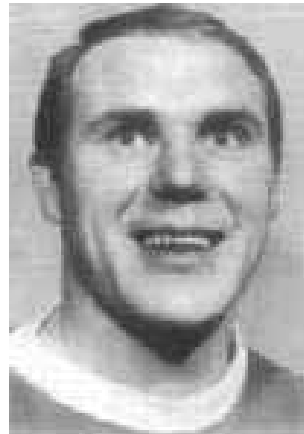


GOOD MEN AND WOMEN
