BRADFORD LEAGUE.

PRESENTATION OF CUP AND MEDALS.

The Shelf Cricket Club, who are the first to secure the premier place in this the first season of the Bradford Cricket League, on Saturday received the cup and medals which the committee had provided for the purpose of suitably rewarding the club which should prove the victors.
