Height heist

BOB MARSDEN'S letter (*TWC*, July) about the highest ground in England reminded me of some of the research carried out by the University of Huddersfield's excellent cricket heritage project. This covers only the Kirklees and Calderdale areas of West Yorkshire but has listed the altitudes of all the clubs. Only Cartworthe Moor and Uppertong, both near Holmfirth, come into the reckoning at 310 and 295 metres respectively. We discovered that just outside that area, Queensbury, also in West Yorkshire, is even higher at 361 metres. Yet these pale into insignificance to the ground at Chail, India which claims to be the highest in the world at 7,500 feet.
