### STONES WIN PARISH CUP.

After staging a remarkable recovery Stones won the Halifax Parish Challenge Cup on Saturday, beating Stainland at "The Ramsdens," King Cross, by 37 runs. Batting first, Stones soon ran into trouble and lost their first five wickets with only six runs on the board. Then a partnership between H. Brown and T. Morton produced a valuable 25 runs and stopped the rot. Brown played a heroic innings and his 33, under the circumstances was an extremely fine effort. The last wicket pair F. Senior and D. Eastwood also showed what could be done with the bowling and they carried the score from 75 to 105, Eastwood hitting up 22 and reaching the boundary on five occasions. Holroyd with five for 34 was the most successful Stainland bowler. Stainland gave a poor display with the bat and the whole side was dismissed for 68, Morton claiming four wickets for seven runs.
