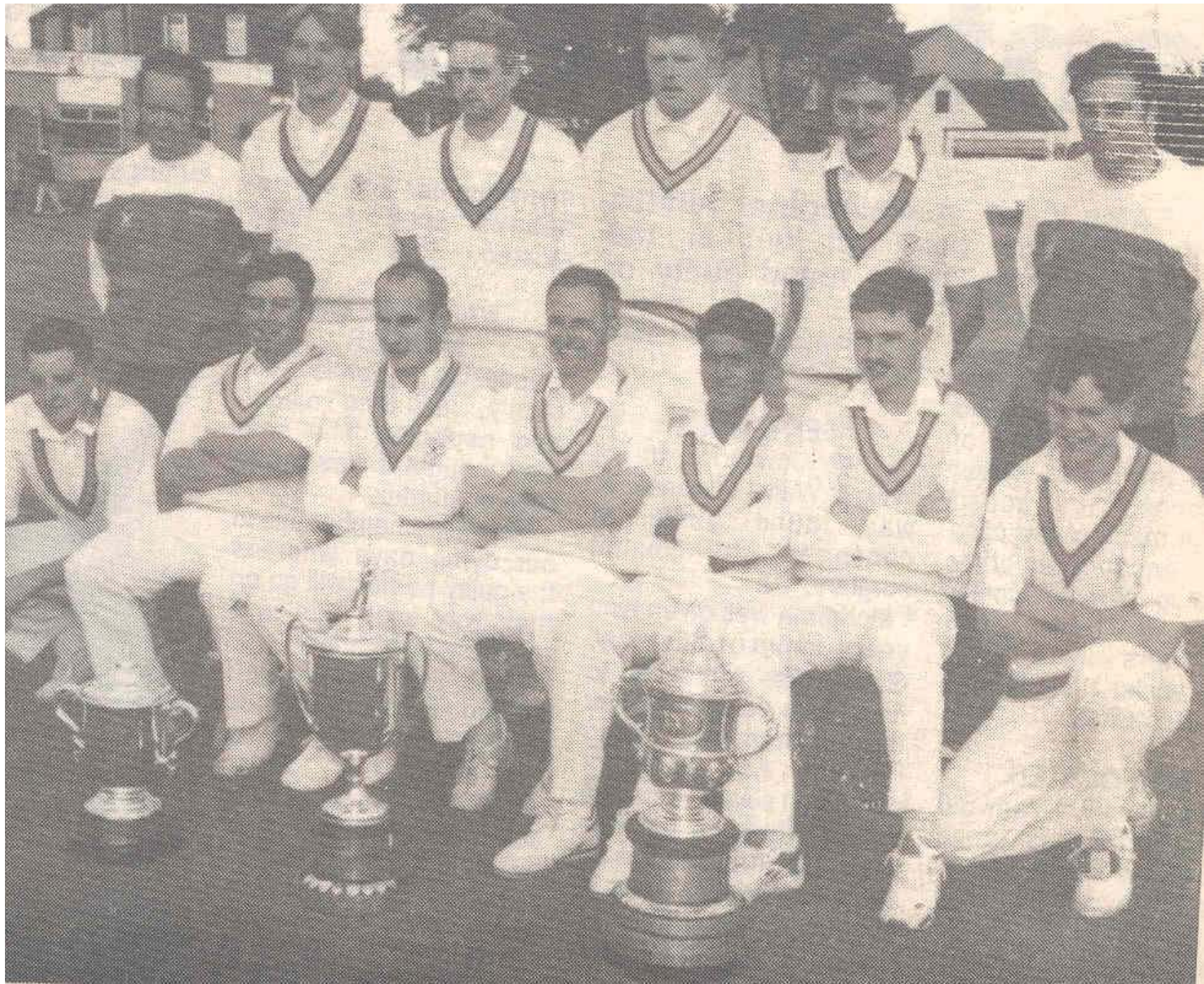

HAT-TRICK OF TRIUMPHS

Gomersal Cricket Club retained the Heavy Woollen Cup in style, outplaying opponents Staithwaite at Ossett to win by nine wickets. The victory featured a second wicket stand of 172 between the prolific James Pamment and David Ellis, with Pamment scoring 126. The Heavy Woollen victory was the first of a hat-trick of triumphs for Gomersal as they took the honours in the Jack Hampshire Memorial Trophy for the third consecutive season and also captured the Central Yorkshire League title for the first time in the club's 101 year history. Pamment, who will be playing for East Bierley next season, scored well over 2,000 runs in all competitions and his opening partner, Foster scored over 1,000 runs in the Central Yorkshire League alone.
