

Centenary Year

Cricket has been played at Oxford Road, Gomersal for 100 years - prior to 1929 it was played under the name of St Mary's but became Gomersal Cricket Club in that year when the land was given to the club for the use of long term cricket.

The new club house and scoreboard were erected in 1972 which combined with a first class ground makes Gomersal the envy of the other local cricket clubs.

Gomersal is represented in the Central Yorkshire League by two teams who also compete in all the local cup competitions. Junior sides are represented at three

levels Under 17's, Under 15's and Under 13's.

Youngsters have consistently won representative honours at all levels including Yorkshire Colt standard.

The club had a very successful year last year winning the Heavy Woollen Cup, Jack Hampshire Cup and the Championship Play-off Title. However the League Championship eluded us yet again, finishing second to Soothill, but the club is determined to win it this year whilst defending our successful and total domination of other competitions.

It is the Centenary Year of the club and along with a special Gala day a book is being produced detailing the historical aspects of the club along side the growth of the village. The Gala day will include a fancy dress parade, which was always the highlight of the gala day in years long gone by. Local support for the club in its Centenary year will be most welcome.
