His innings of 89 was something to remember, helping his team to a respectable 203. As often happens in fun games the scores were level, an honourable draw for a fun day.

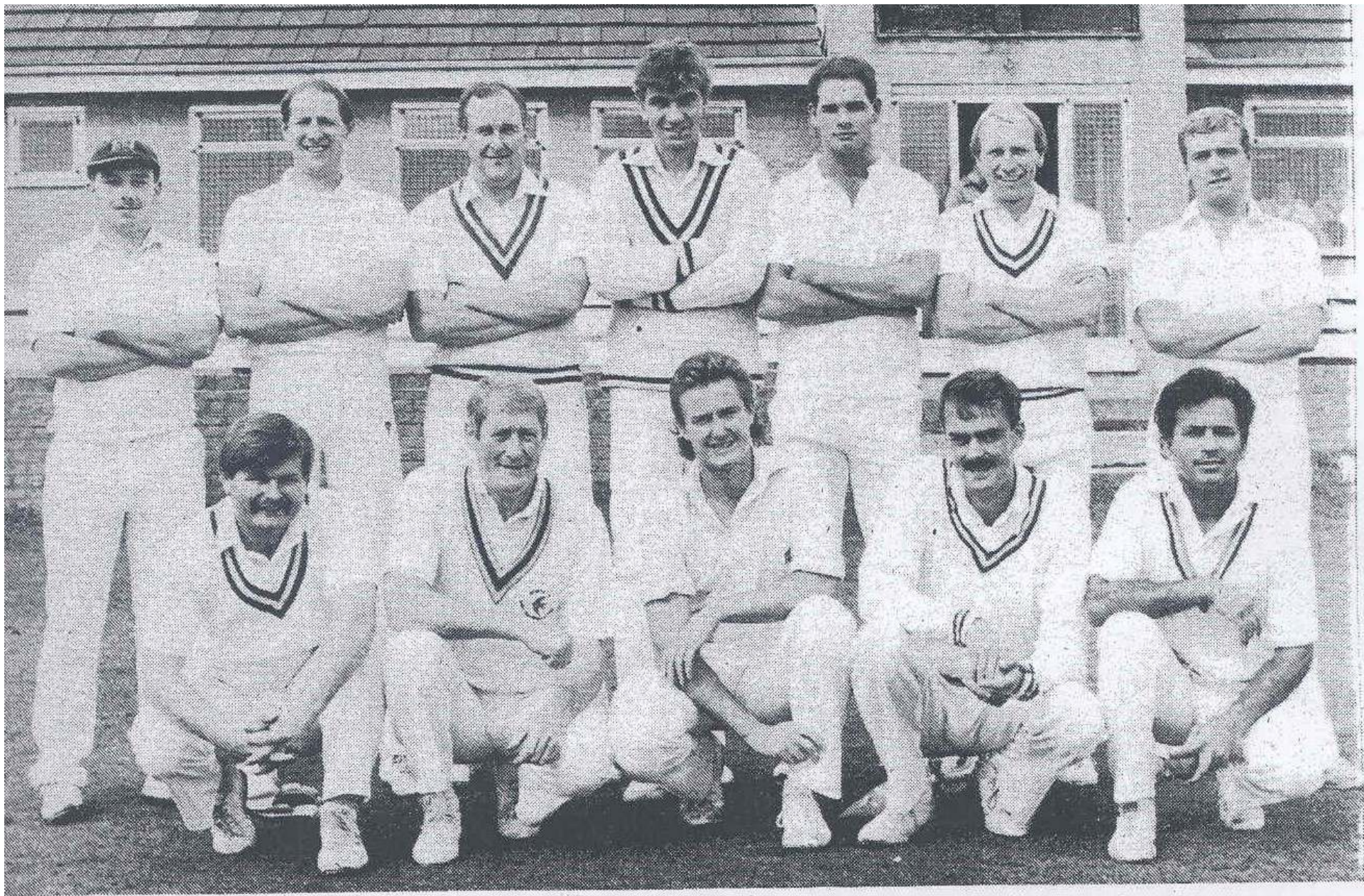
As a memento Tony was presented with a unique Gomersal Taverners tie and jumper.
