

Emley And Leymoor Go Up

PROMOTION and relegation issues were finally settled on the last day of the Huddersfield Central Cricket League season last Saturday, and, as a result, Emley Clarence and Leymoor gained promotion from Section "B," and Cartworth Moor and Clayton West lost their Section "A" status.

Also worthy of note was Denby Dale's performance in winning the second team championship for the sixth year in succession.

Holmebridge, who had already made sure of the Section "A" championship, won their final match of the season against Thurstonland to give themselves a four-point margin over Skelmanthorpe.

They had to fight hard for their victory however, for after having made 152, with E. Fearn playing a good innings of 52, well supported by J. Kaye (33), their bowlers were hard put to it to dismiss Thurstonland. Some steady batting by R. Porter (53) and C. Booth gave Thurstonland hopes of victory, but the partnership was broken when Booth was run out for 22, and Thurstonland just failed by eight runs in their bid for victory.

In Section "B," Emley made sure of promotion by beating Lepton Highlanders, to finish with thirty-two points, and in the battle for the second promotion place, Leymoor beat Shelley in their last game.

These two teams were level with twenty-six points each before the game, but on Saturday Shelley's batting collapsed after their bowlers had performed nobly to dismiss Leymoor for 96. E. Coulson made 36.

Shelley never recovered from a bad start, and some fine bowling by D. Sheard (6-13) and R. Pearson (4-19) put them out for the poor total of 32.

Another important game was that between Cartworth Moor and Cumberland United, which Cumberland won to avoid relegation from Section "A." Cartworth Moor being the unlucky club to accompany Clayton West into the lower section.

Cumberland made light of their task in this game, for some good bowling by D. Smith (6-23) helped to dismiss Cartworth Moor for 67, and Cumberland knocked off the runs in confident style for the loss of only one wicket.

Skelmanthorpe beat Denby Dale by fifty runs to become runners-up in Section "A." B. Hoyle made 49 of their total of 108, and then the bowling combination of D. Tyas (6-25) and W. Booth (4-33) dismissed their opponents for 58.

Fallon's First Major Success
