

Mirfield Lose to Savile An Eleven.

Mirfield entertained Savile An Eleven, by whom they were defeated. Atkinson and Robinson opened the batting for the visitors, but the latter had his sticks spreadeagled when he had knocked a single. Mayall and Atkinson carried the score from 3 to 39. Atkinson compiled 26, and Mayall 16. Milner reached 13, when he was caught by Sheard, off Rawson. Shaw knocked three boundaries, but when he had reached 16 Lawton got past his defence. The next five wickets put on 31 runs, and Mirfield had to face a total of 107.

The homesters made a good start, and when the first wicket fell for 44, it looked a safe thing for Mirfield. Lawton and Radcliffe were the first pair of batsmen, and compiled respectively 24 and 26. Rawson was the next to visit the wicket, but he was dismissed for none. Grounds scored 4, and Baynor 3, and then followed Walker with another "duck." The last five wickets put on 12 runs, and the whole side were out for 70, thus losing by 37. Bateman took five wickets for 15 runs, and Mayall five for 13, while 16 runs were scored off Saville, and 17 off Milner, without either taking a wicket.
