

# HOLDEN CUP

## Allsop's Fine Innings for Cumberworth

Cumberworth United on Saturday won the Holden Cup by defeating Cartworth Moor at Skelmanthorpe by sixty runs. It was their first success in this competition, but they have been League champions on four occasions—in 1920, 1923, 1924, and 1928.

A fine innings by F. Allsop, one of the Cumberworth opening batsmen, laid the foundation to the victory on Saturday. He played a magnificent game for his side, and was only five runs short of the century when he was dismissed. D. Cook gave him good assistance with a good score of 37, but of the other batsmen only A. Tarkatt (12) and A. Cook (12) reached double figures. Cumberworth's total reached 184, and Cartworth Moor were set a difficult task to win.

H Mellor, their captain, and one of their most reliable batsmen, was dismissed after scoring 8, but then T. Heeley and N. Barker engaged in a productive stand which improved the score materially. Heeley scored 21 and Barker 40.

After two more players had been dismissed without scoring J. Gee came in and made himself the second highest scorer of his side with a well-played innings of 34.

It was at this point that Cartworth Moor collapsed. Not one of the last five men could get double figures, and the innings closed at 124.

Three bowlers took four wickets in the match. For Cumberworth A. Horn had four for 2 and H. Horn four for 48, and H. Mellor took four for 49 for Cartworth Moor.
