An overall loss on the year of £251 was reported by the treasurer, Mr. D. Bailey, at the annual meeting of Armitage Bridge Cricket Club.

The general account had shown a profit of £1,163, compared with £295 the previous year, but this had been put towards the new clubroom, on which £2,424 had been spent during the year.

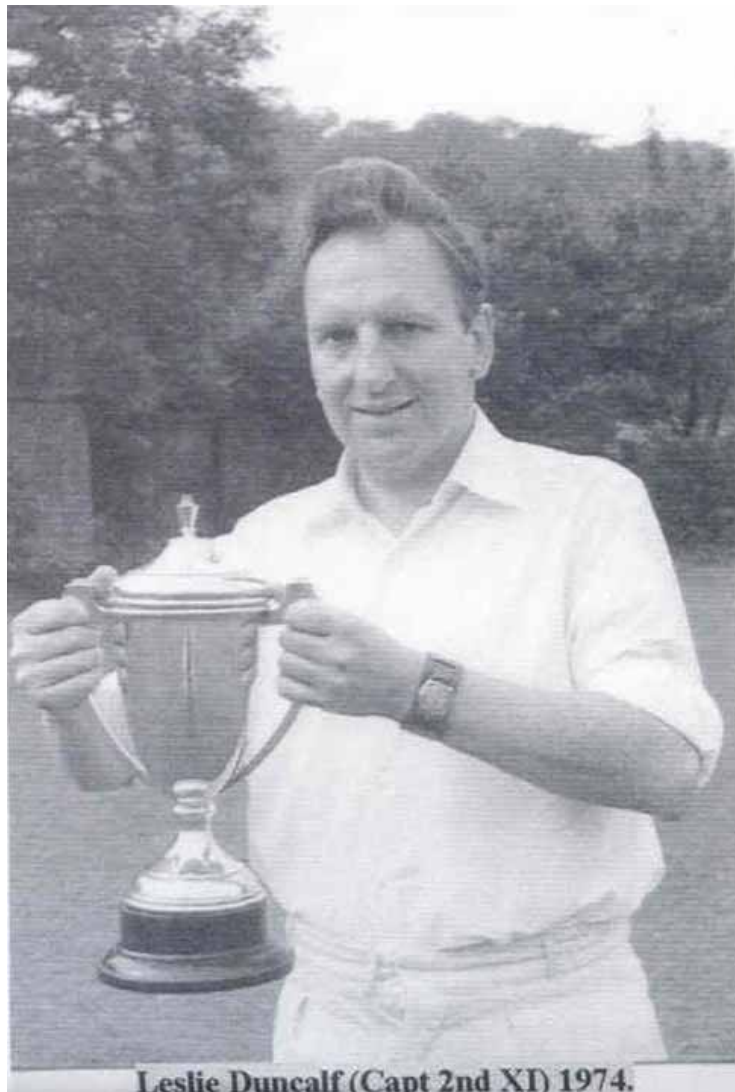
Mainly responsible for the increased income were two cheese and wine discos which raised £497, while the ground improvement scheme continued to improve and made a profit of £344.

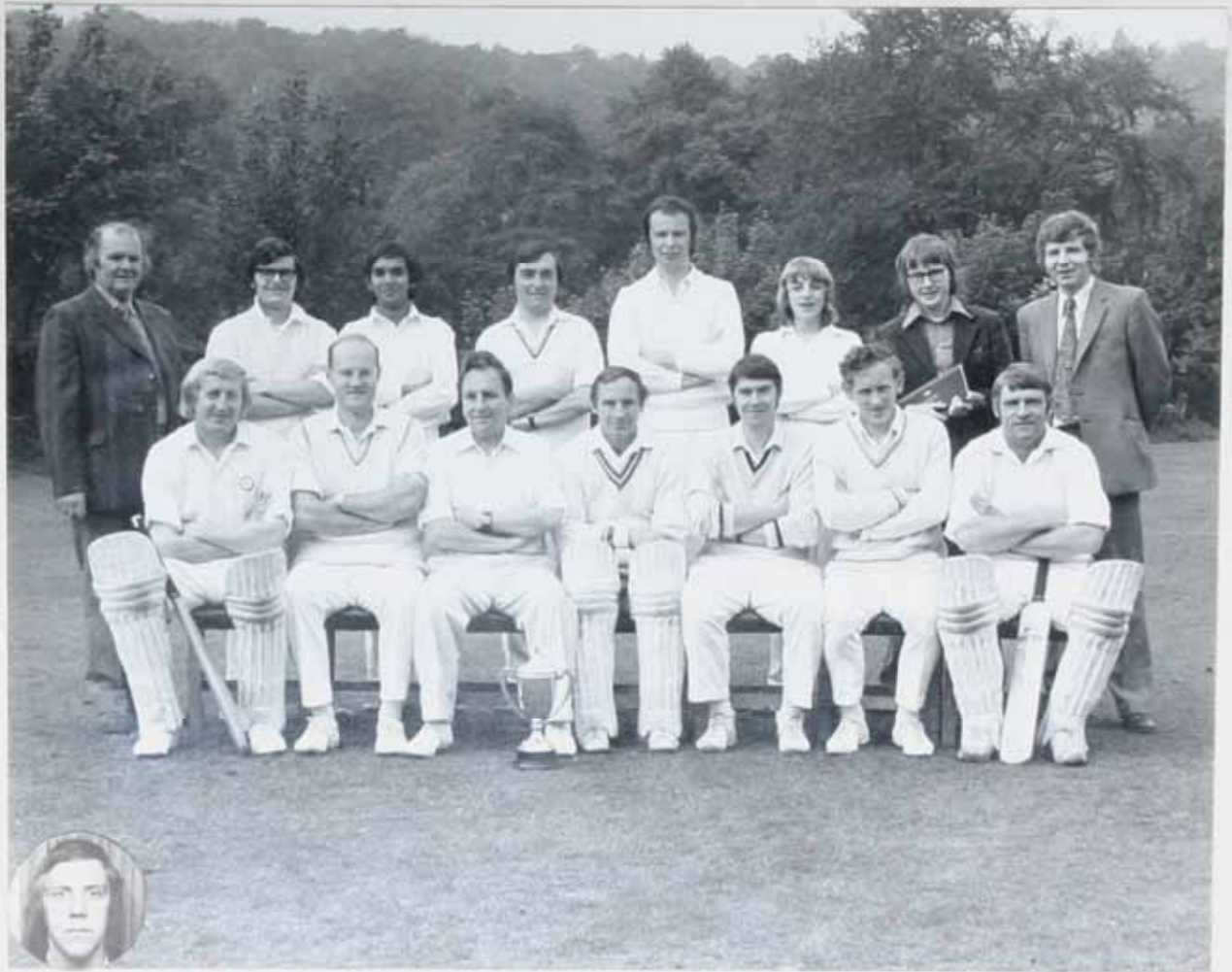
