It was on the 19th of September we went to Sheffield Ground  
To try and do our very best to win that hundred pound ;  
We won the toss, we took our bats, we laid them on the ball,  
And said we are them eleven lads that come from Lascelles Hall.

There were Luke Greenwood and John Thewlis, and Andrew too  
I mean,  
David Eastwood and Tom Redfearn they were so sharp and keen ;  
They took their bats, and handled them well, and showed both  
one and all  
The way to use a cricket bat, and how to cut a ball.

We scored 210, my friends, against Sheffield 106,  
I am sure that put the Sheffielders all into a fix ;  
But in their second innings they made a better stand,  
Owing to the batting of Stephenson, who came out bat in hand.
