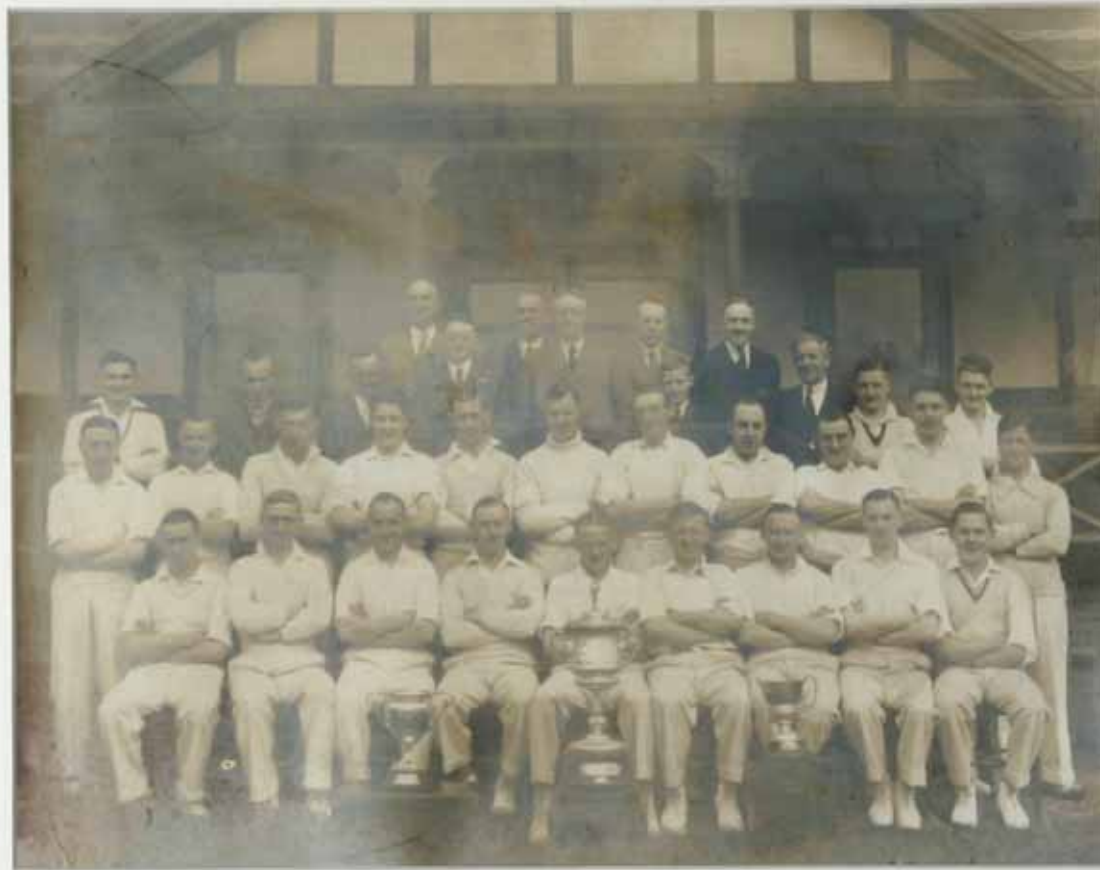

EASY VICTORY OVER TRIANGLE.
 Mytholmroyd and its competitors

PRESENTATION OF THE CUP.

 Ald. Radcliffe congratulated the My-
 tholmroyd team on their brilliant victory,

 royd Club, making a vote of thanks to the
 Mayor, referred to the fact that cricket
 had sustained through the death of Ald.
 W. Bennett, J.P., of 100 years, who for
 many years represented the club on the
 Yorkshire County Cricket Club Com-

HALIFAX LEAGUE I.

Mytholmroyd first team visited Dean Clough in their final game of the season, and a victory by five wickets takes them to the head of the league table. Greetland, who should have a game with Siddal tomorrow, are the only team left with a chance to equal the record of the 'Royders. Should Greetland's game be played they must win to make a play-off necessary, but the position at the time of writing these notes is uncertain. Against Dean Clough Mytholmroyd were nearly baulked of victory by stoppages for rain. The home team knocked up 75, F. L. Greenwood taking 4 for 13 and B. Bove 3 for 20. Dean Clough's "tail-end" batsmen were mainly responsible for bringing their total up to this figure, for eight wickets fell for only 39 runs. With little time left to win, the 'Royders changed their usual batting order and went all out for runs. F. L. Greenwood hit up a capital 41 not out, he and L. Summerscales being together when the home score was passed with five wickets in hand. Mytholmroyd's record for the season is: Played 18, won 9, lost 2, drawn 7, 25 points. Booth, who have held a leading position throughout the season, are at present second in the table with 24 points from 18 matches—one point behind the 'Royders.
