## 1910 Kirkburton Champions

### ALLIANCE.

Hearty congratulations to Kirkburton on their successful season. They have for year after year made strenuous efforts to head the Alliance table, and in spite of all disappointments and ill-luck they have stuck pluckily to their task, and they thoroughly deserve the position they have gained for themselves by their untiring efforts. They had their most dangerous rivals as guests, and so well did J. A. Dyson (seven for 32) bowl that the home men were left with time enough to win if they were good enough. Tom Smith and Dyson soon set to work, and gave their side such an excellent start that a five wickets victory enabled the Burtoners to qualify for higher honours. If pluck and perseverance will do it Kirkburton will make their presence felt in the Huddersfield League next year.

Lepton accomplished a smart performance in making themselves safe from the bottom place in the Alliance. They went to Meltham, and after getting rid of the home men for 127, they knocked off the runs for the loss of one wicket. Ernest Jessop played well for 40, but the honours of the day were carried off by B. Ellis, with 83 not out. This means that Meltham have met the fate feared by Lepton, for the ex-League club are at the bottom of the list with a completed programme.

Prisrose Hill and Honley Westwards played a drawn game, in which the former put on 146 by consistent scoring, and the visitors 128 for seven wickets.
