COMBINATION.

Cumberworth United had a keen match at Shepley. The visitors on form were expected to win, but the Shepleyites played for all they were worth, and time saved them from defeat. For Shepley, Fred Sykes, the professional, who has been re-engaged for the season of 1900, was by far and away the best man. He captured eight wickets for 27 runs, and scored 18 not out. Tarbutt (19), Turton (11), Jagger and Peace (10 each), enabled the visitors to declare; and W. Booth took five wickets at the small cost of 14 runs.

Thurstonians won easily at home again, as against Walker (five for 15) and Maraden (four for 25) Lepton totalled only 47 (W. Murchouse 16, and Hanson not out 13). Walker was also the hero of the home batting, for he made 40 not out, which spoiled some good analyses that were being made till he went in.

Helms also won easily at home. Netherthong found Taylor (seven for 21) very difficult. Two men made a dozen each, but with H. Robinson taking three for 17, the total was only 60. Senior and Watson batted well
