6 attempts at throwing as accurately as you can – hit a single stump to score points

Skill 5 – Speed demon!

How fast can you bowl a cricket ball? – our speed test will tell you in miles per hour

Skill 6 – Stopwatch fielding challenge!

Start at the stumps, run to the balls that are placed on the markers and throw them to the wicket keeper, your time stops when the last ball reaches the keeper
