# The Sheepridge and District CRICKET LEAGUE.



## RULES, 1905.

1.—The League shall be called "THE SHEEPRIDGE AND DISTRICT CRICKET LEAGUE."

2.—The League shall consist of 12 Clubs, and shall be governed by two representatives from each Club, out of which shall be elected a Chairman and Hon. Treasurer, any member being thus elected shall be a representative of the Club he is a member of. Five Clubs represented to form a quorum at any League Meeting, and if any representative is unable to attend, he may send a substitute, who must be a bona-fide member.

3.—The Annual Meeting shall be held not later than the Second Wednesday in November of each year, to receive reports, make all elections, alteration of rules, and fixtures for the ensuing season. All League matches to be arranged previous to any other fixtures, home and away. No alteration of these Rules shall take effect unless carried by a majority of two-thirds of the members present at a League Meeting.

4.—The subscriptions shall be 10/- per annum for the 1st elevens and 5/- per annum for the 2nd elevens, subject to a further call, if necessary; such subscriptions to be paid not later than April 1st each year.

5.—The League Committee shall arrange Home and Home Fixtures for each Club between the 2nd Saturday in April and the 2nd Saturday in Sept., each Club to carry out its matches with its best available eleven. The matches shall commence at 3 o'clock, and shall proceed until 6-30, if necessary, and that all matches be decided by the first innings. In all cases where a late start is made, except on account of bad weather, the time lost must be made up. Play shall proceed until the aforementioned time, even if the match is won, except by mutual agreement of the Captains. Any Club refusing to play when ordered by the Umpires, shall forfeit the match. Umpires must report all breaches of this rule to the League Secretary immediately after the match.

6.—That Neutral Umpires be appointed for both 1st and 2nd elevens, each to be a competent representative, and any Club failing to send one shall be fined 2/- for 1st elevens and 1/- 2nd elevens for each offence. In case an Umpire does not attend it shall be left to the Captains to get one out of the field, who shall be paid 1/- for 1st eleven and 6d. for 2nd eleven matches by the League.

7.—Each Club shall send to the Secretary of the League by April 1st 12 complete lists of competing members, a copy of which list shall be supplied to the Hon. Secretary of each League Club. No member of a Club whose name has not been registered for 6 clear days previous to date of match, be

allowed to play in same. All additions to be notified to the respective Secretaries by the Secretary of the League. That after May 1st any Club registering new members shall pay 3d. for each new member registered. That playing members of clubs outside this League shall not be allowed to play without the consent of the League. Any Club playing an ineligible man shall have two points deducted. Substitutes only allowed subject to the approval of the opposing team, which substitute shall not be allowed to bowl, and the score-book to be closed when he goes in to bat.

8.—The Home Club shall send to the Secretary of the League the result of each match within 3 days after being played, failing which they shall be fined 6d. for each offence.

9.—A match won shall count 2 points and a drawn game 1 point; the Club gaining the highest number of points to be adjudged the Champion of the League. Matches not played on account of bad weather shall be counted as drawn games, and each Club shall receive 1 point provided they appear on the field of play.

10.—All protests to be lodged with the League Secretary and the Secretary of the Club objected to within 48 hours of the match, in writing, and to be accompanied with a fee of 3/-, which shall be forfeited if the protest be considered frivolous.

11.—Any dispute having reference to the interpretation of the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the M.C.C. for settlement, but in all other matters the decision of the League shall be final.

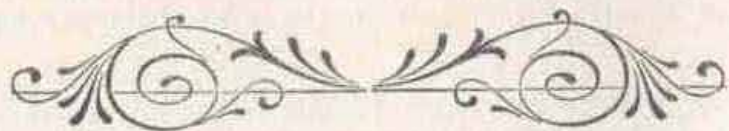
12.—All matches to be played on the dates arranged, and any Club failing to fulfil a League engagement shall forfeit the match, and have 1 point deducted.

13.—No member of a Club in this League shall play with more than one Club in League Matches in any one year without the consent of the League Committee.

14.—The League shall have power to deal with any offending club or clubs, player or players, as they may think fit, and to deal with any matter not provided for in these Rules.

15.—That no member be allowed to transfer from one Club to another, unless he has paid his subscription to the Club he is transferring from.

16.—That the qualification for the batting average for the League be 12 innings, and for the bowling average 40 wickets.
