Interview with Andrew Parker, ex-Stones CC Webmaster

When did your club website go online? Approximately 3 years ago.

How many people help with the website apart from you? David Armitage may be taking on more of the work.



What are your main day-to-day tasks as webmaster? Day-to-day tasks - none. At weekends (or perhaps early the following week), I would try to account for results from the weekend and other news. However (and this is the big issue with website maintenance) it is all subject to whether club management support the website and whether captains and others keep me informed.

Which features of the site are most popular with club members or general browsers? Hard to say. The intention was to keep all members and former members, especially those which couldn't get to the club very often, informed with news, results, events, history, developments etc.

In your opinion, what is special and unique about your club in general? I believe Stones was one of the earliest members of the Halifax League. It has a very active youth development programme, and is currently developing the clubhouse and changing facilities.

What do you like most about your ground? It is one of the highest, certainly in the Halifax League (Illingworth may be higher) and may be also in Yorkshire and the country - who knows? There are fabulous views in almost all directions but with the prevailing winds generally westerly you can imagine there's a lot of rain to be had...
