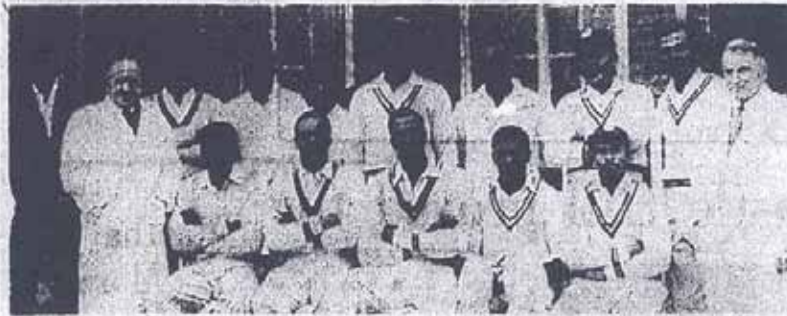

Fine innings by captain for winners

THE West Indians gained a fine victory in the Huddersfield and District Cricket Association's Lumb Cup final when the game was completed at Brook Motors' ground, Birkby, on Tuesday.

Highlight of the game, which was interrupted by a thunderstorm on Saturday, and continued on Monday and Tuesday evening, was a brilliant innings of 86 by the West Indians' captain, Stanley Inniss.

Rastrick New Road, the holders of the trophy, and last year's League champions, batted first and made 141, of which Wilfred Bottomley made 44.

Their opponents, with Inniss leading the way, scored the runs required for victory for the loss of six wickets, after 116 of them had come for the loss of three wickets on Monday evening.

The trophy and also the "Sportsman Award" for the player of the match was presented to the West Indian captain, Stanley Inniss, by Mr. Herbert Robinson, a vice-president of the District League.

Mr. Albert Bottomley, president of the Association, presided.
