'Sir Learie Constantine' All Rounder Trophy.

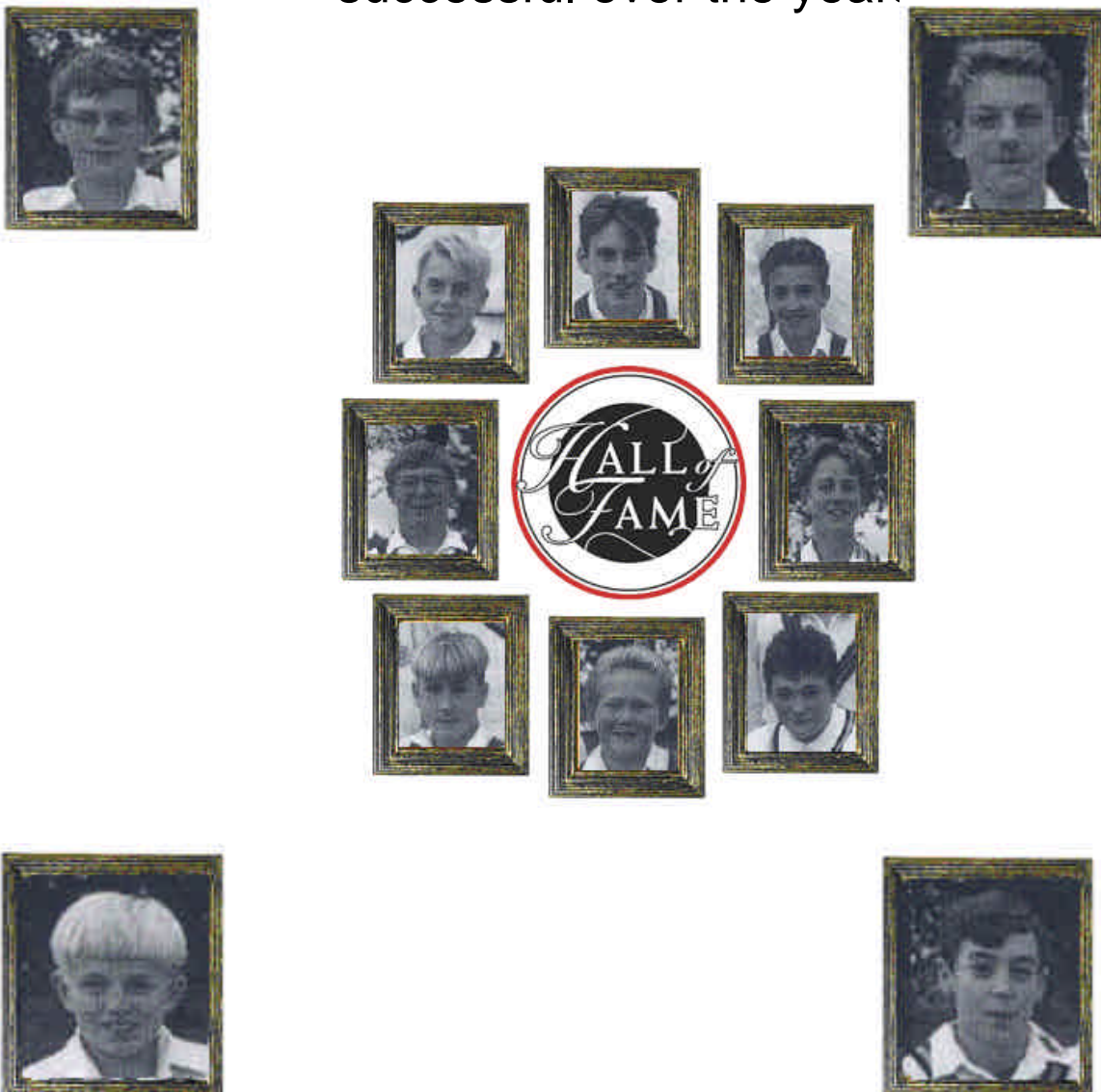


DAVE HALLETT
