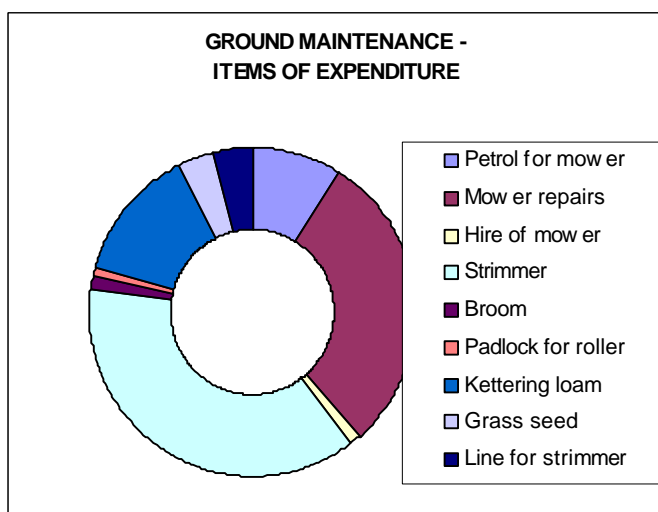


# GROUND MAINTENANCE

## ITEMS OF EXPENDITURE - 1991

A cricket ground requires constant care. The pitch in particular always needs to be kept at a high standard.

There are lots of things that a club needs to purchase, therefore, to keep the ground in good condition. Essential maintenance-related items can often prove very costly.

## MOWERS AND ROLLERS!

Mowers and rollers are the most important items in a groundsman's locker. These items are expensive and can often malfunction!

On many occasions the Club's balance sheets show losses that have occurred due to the expensive cost of repairing the mower and roller. For example, this was the case in 1988 due to the need to purchase a new cylinder mower. Also, in 1991 the Club revealed an overall profit of £189 on the year, ***'due largely to there being no mower repairs.'***

# PAVILION HQ

## CLUBHOUSE PROBLEMS

The pavilion at Chapel Lane has endured a long and difficult history.



The pavilion caused much debate when, in 1947, during the re-formation of the Cricket Club after the War, it was decided that it would be pulled down and another smaller one rebuilt. Club members were divided on the issue!

In 1993 there was an arson attack on the pavilion. This was then followed by a burglary and a vandal attack. £600 was spent on repairs after this episode

and wrought iron bars were added to the doors and windows for extra security. At the time of this redevelopment, the pavilion gained a new roof made of corrugated steel sheets. Finally, a galvanised steel shed was erected to safely store the Club's machinery.
