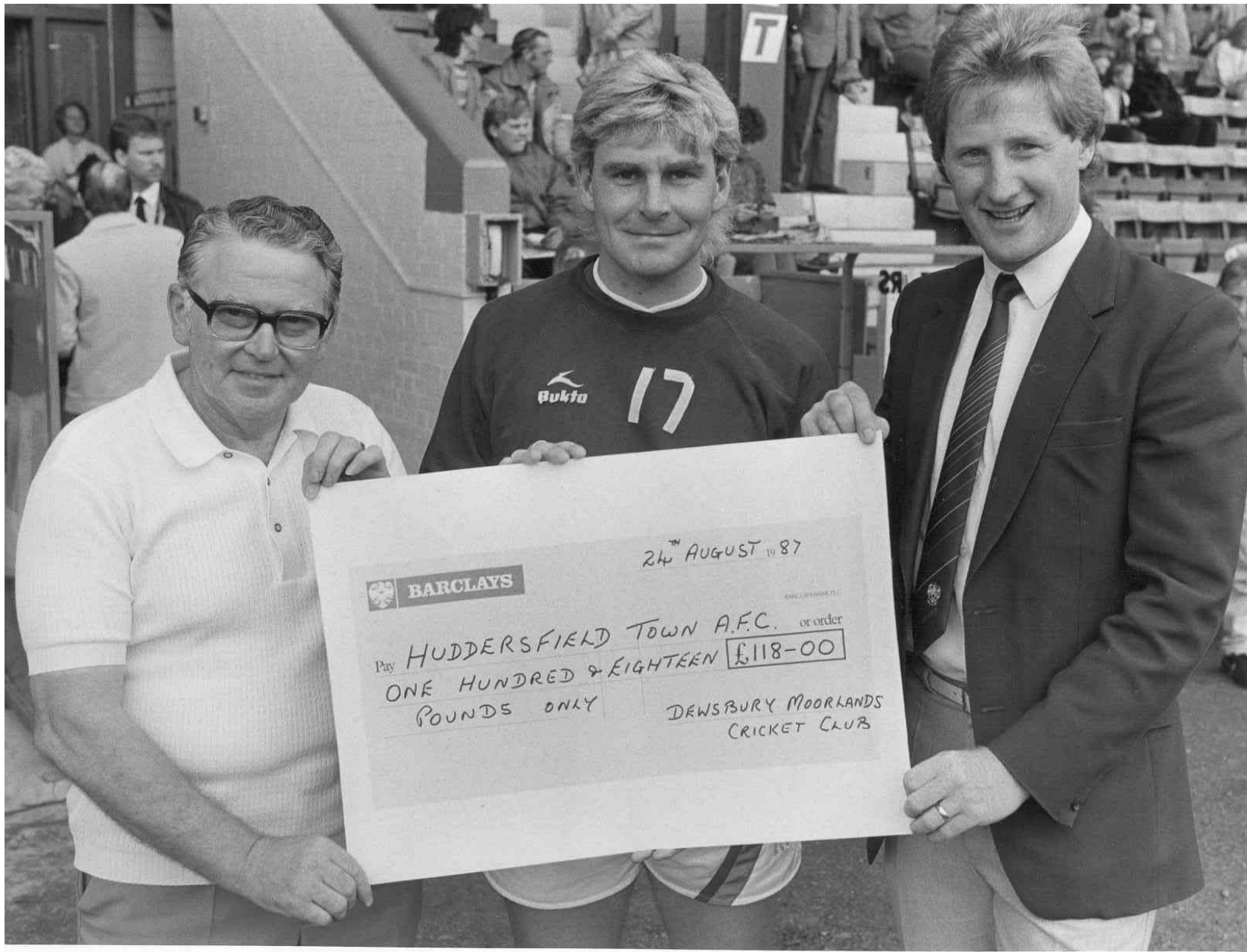

GUEST PRESENTER

G. ROLPH started playing with Netherton in 1946 when the Club re-started after the war and finished in 1978 owing to injury. Playing in the Wakefield League until 1954, the Derby Grange League until 1964, then the Dewsbury League until retiring. He was a member of the Executive Committee at Dewsbury from 1965 until 1973. Has been Treasurer of the Club since 1949.

OUR HOSTS

NETHERTON'S exact date of formation is not known. They have been playing in the Village since the early 1900's. From then until the present day the Club has played on three fields, twice having to move when the grounds were sold for housing. The Club played in the Derby Grange League until World War 2, when it was closed down due to lack of players. In 1946 it was re-formed and joined the Wakefield District Union. 1955 saw the Derby Grange League re-formed and Netherton won both the K.O. Cup and Championship. In 1965, as Champions, when the League was disbanded, Netherton applied to join the Dewsbury and District League and were accepted in Section 'B', winning promotion to Section 'A' in their first season. From 1972 to 1975 the Club played at Green Park, Horbury, whilst acquiring its present ground at Balk Lane, Netherton. The most successful season for Netherton was in the Dewsbury League in 1983, winning the Section 'A' Championship, after being promoted the previous season and also the A. V. Kitchen Cup and being the first winners of the Roysons Super Cup.

THE TEAMS

DEWSBURY MOORLANDS originally formed as Dewsbury Moorlands Methodists Cricket Club celebrated its centenary in 1984. After playing at Sands Lane, Dewsbury, for a number of years, they have moved this year to Mirfield Memorial Park. They reached the semi-finals last year but lost to the eventual winners.

DEWSBURY YOUNG STAR were formed in 1972 by young cricket fanatics from Savile Town. They won 'C' Section in 1975, 'B' Section in 1980 and 'A' Section in 1982. They have also been successful in other competitions - winning the Homfray Trophy in 1983, 1985, 1986 and 1987 and the Sheard Cup in 1985.

THE UMPIRES

A. RUSSELL started playing cricket at the age of 15, playing for Thornhill Edge in the old Derby Grange League, until 1966, when due to working commitments had to pack in. Had a brief spell with W.W.A. in 1968 before taking up umpiring in 1980.

D. RUSSELL, after playing cricket at school, started playing for W.W.A. in 1966 and left them in 1979 to become a Founder Member of Corinthians C.C. Played for Corinthians during their first season but retired due to a bad knee injury during the following winter. Began umpiring the following season and has continued ever since apart from an attempted playing comeback with Thornhill Falcons, which lasted for only half of the 1984 season.

Royson Super Cup goes to Young Star

Dewsbury Moorlands 118, Dewsbury Young Star 119-5
 A PARTNERSHIP between A m j a d Hussain and Yakub Valli for the fourth Young Star wicket gave their side victory in the Royson Super Cup final.

Put in to bat, Moorlands lost wickets steadily with Yunus Patel taking 5-44 and Adam Patel 5-55.

Only Richard Blakeley with 25 and an innings of 24 from number ten batsman Brian Taylor gave the Moorlands total any respectability.

Young Star lost both openers cheaply but Hussain steadied the innings to remain 40 not out at the end.

Yunus Patel departed quickly but, in Yakub Valli, who hit 41, Hussain found a partner who could stay with him.

Blakeley finished with 2-41 off 15 overs for Moorlands.
