## On top of the world

Upper Hopton Cricket Club is situated on a series of three main terraces. The clubhouse stands on the central one and, surrounded by mature trees, gives the right impression. The site of the clubhouse and the other buildings of the ground are on a slight rise for the cricket, and the trees which form the appropriate boundary give a fine feel of a first-class club. Visitors can get a bird's-eye view of the scene.



Getting up the terrace to the clubhouse and platform is possible on to a series of steps. Together, they form the back of a high table, surrounded from the clubhouse to water for visitors to gain access and take advantage of the panoramic views of the playing area and the countryside beyond.

Behind the clubhouse is an imposing 21-gate, wicketless but superbly finished stone wall. The ground has a slight rise towards the clubhouse and the position of the clubhouse and gate give the impression that the ground and the position are a natural right-hand side of the ground.
